appropriately	In a manner that is suitable or proper in the circumstances. <i>Volunteers need to be approachable calm and able to respond appropriately.</i>
cadre	A member of an activist group. <i>He was an activist in the cadre.</i>
career	The time spent by a person in a career. <i>The coach careered across the road and went through a hedge.</i>
certified	Fit to be certified as insane and treated accordingly. <i>A certified accountant.</i>
competent	Acceptable and satisfactory, though not outstanding. <i>A competent typist.</i>
consultant	An expert who gives advice. <i>He acted as campaign consultant to the president.</i>
disciplined	Obeying the rules. <i>A disciplined mind.</i>
domesticated	Fond of home life and housework. <i>Some men think it unmanly to be domesticated others find gratification in it.</i>
elite	A group or class of persons enjoying superior intellectual or social or economic status. <i>An elite athlete.</i>
experienced	Having experience; having knowledge or skill from observation or participation. <i>An experienced social worker.</i>
guest	A person staying at a hotel or guest house. <i>A guest speaker.</i>
knowledgeable	Highly educated; having extensive information or understanding. <i>She is very knowledgeable about livestock and pedigrees.</i>

learned	Showing, requiring, or characterized by learning; scholarly. <i>A learned jurist.</i>
manpower	The force of workers available. <i>The police had only limited manpower.</i>
mason	A Freemason. <i>The other building was masoned up out of hewn limestone.</i>
medically	In a way that relates to the science or practice of medicine. <i>Patients may be treated medically or surgically.</i>
moderator	In the Presbyterian church, the officer who presides over a synod or general assembly. <i>The debates will each feature one moderator and a panel of three questioners.</i>
panelist	A member of a panel.
practiced	Skillful after much practice. <i>A practiced marksman.</i>
professional	Worthy of or appropriate to a professional person competent skilful or assured. <i>A professional cook.</i>
professionally	As a person's paid occupation rather than on an amateur basis. <i>She has sung professionally with opera companies around the world.</i>
qualified	Holding appropriate documentation and officially on record as qualified to perform a specified function or practice a specified skill. <i>Many qualified applicants for the job.</i>
seasoned	(of wood) made suitable for use as timber by adjusting its moisture content. <i>Seasoned flour.</i>
skilled	Having or showing or requiring special skill. <i>A skilled reconstruction of her damaged elbow.</i>
specialty	The special line of work you have adopted as your career.
staff	Provide with staff. <i>The general relied on his staff to make routine decisions.</i>
suitably	To a degree that is expected or appropriate in the circumstances. <i>The judges were suitably impressed.</i>
trained	(of a mental or physical faculty) having been developed and improved through instruction or practice. <i>Trained volunteers provide a sympathetic ear and friendly advice.</i>

Rendered competent through trial and experience.

Veteran steadiness.

workforce

The force of workers available.
