- *A piece of material sewn on the inside of a garment, especially at the neck and armholes, to strengthen it.*
- *A lining applied to the edge of a garment for ornamentation or strengthening.*
- *The cuffs, collar, and lapels of a military jacket, contrasting in colour with the rest of the garment.*
- *A protective covering that protects the outside of a building.*
- *An outer layer covering the surface of a wall.*
- *An ornamental coating to a building.*
- *Providing something with a surface of a different material.*

backing	Financial resources provided to make some project possible. <i>The trio provided backing.</i>
cladding	A protective covering that protects the outside of a building. <i>Timber cladding.</i>
coating	An outer garment that has sleeves and covers the body from shoulder down; worn outdoors. <i>The surface was ready for a coating of paint.</i>
covering	The act of protecting something by covering it. <i>A vinyl floor covering.</i>
dressing	Savory dressings for salads basically of two kinds either the thin French or vinaigrette type or the creamy mayonnaise type. <i>An antiseptic dressing.</i>
facade	The principal front of a building, that faces on to a street or open space. <i>Her flawless public facade masked private despair.</i>
false front	A sphere of activity involving effort.
front	The part of a garment covering a person's front. <i>Porridge slopped from the tray on to his shirt front.</i>
fronting	The side that is forward or prominent.
inlay	A material or substance that is used as an inlay. <i>Mother of pearl is widely used as an inlay in furniture and musical instruments.</i>
interfacing	An extra layer of material or an adhesive stiffener that is applied to the facing of a garment to add support.
lamination	Bonding thin sheets together.
lining	The act of attaching an inside lining to a garment or curtain etc. <i>Self clean oven linings.</i>
overlay	A block of code or other data transferred during the overlay process. <i>Full colour aerial photographs with overlays showing suggested routes.</i>
paving	The act of applying paving materials to an area. <i>Weeds had forced their way up through the cracked paving.</i>
plating	The process of applying plating. <i>The tractors carried steel plating for protection.</i>
reinforcement	Information that makes more forcible or convincing. <i>Older electricity mains required reinforcement to meet increased demand.</i>

revetment A barrier against explosives.

skin A skinhead.
*Your **skin** is the largest organ of your body.*

surface The outer boundary of an artifact or a material layer constituting or resembling such a boundary.
*It was not what it appeared to be on the **surface**.*

trimming Small pieces trimmed off something.
*Roast turkey with all the **trimmings**.*

veneer A crown in which the restoration is placed over the prepared surface of a natural crown.
*A fine grained **veneer**.*



Usage Examples of "Facing" as a noun

- *The bricks were used as a facing on a concrete core.*
- *The regiment's uniforms had orange facings.*

aboveground	On or above the surface of the ground. <i>Aboveground nuclear testing.</i>
appearance	Pretending that something is the case in order to make a good impression. <i>It was Bernhardt s last appearance in America.</i>
<u>canvas</u>	Cover with canvas. <i>A thunderous uppercut sent him crashing to the canvas.</i>
casing	The frame round a door or window. <i>A waterproof casing.</i>
epidermis	The surface epithelium of the skin, overlying the dermis.
<u>exterior</u>	(in filming) outdoor. <i>Exterior locations.</i>

external	(of hardware) not contained in the main computer; peripheral. <i>An external concern for reputation.</i>
externalize	Make external or objective, or give reality to. <i>Elements of the internal construction were externalized on to the facade.</i>
extrinsic	Not part of the essential nature of someone or something; coming or operating from outside. <i>Reasons extrinsic to the music itself.</i>
facade	The face or front of a building. <i>The house has a half timbered facade.</i>
integument	An outer protective covering such as the skin of an animal or a cuticle or seed coat or rind or shell. <i>This chemical compound is found in the integument of the seed.</i>
lining	The act of attaching an inside lining to a garment or curtain etc. <i>Leather gloves with fur linings.</i>
obverse	Of or denoting the obverse of a coin or medal. <i>True solitude is the obverse of true society.</i>
ostensible	Stated or appearing to be true, but not necessarily so. <i>The real dispute which lay behind the ostensible complaint.</i>
outdoor	Pertaining to or concerning the outdoors or outdoor activities. <i>A huge outdoor concert.</i>
outdoors	In or into the open air; outside a building or shelter. <i>He wanted to get outdoors a little.</i>
outer	A shot that strikes the outer. <i>Boots with stiff leather outers.</i>
outermost	Situated at the farthest possible point from a center. <i>The outermost layer of the earth.</i>
outrigger	A projecting support similar to an outrigger in another structure or vehicle.
outside	On the outside. <i>The use of outside contractors will speed up the process.</i>
outward	Outwards. <i>The outward physical body.</i>
outwardly	On or from the outside. <i>An outwardly normal life.</i>
peripheral	A peripheral device. <i>A peripheral control processor.</i>

plywood	A type of strong thin wooden board consisting of two or more layers glued and pressed together with the direction of the grain alternating. <i>Plywood benches.</i>
quasi	Having some resemblance. <i>A quasi success.</i>
reflector	A reflecting telescope.
<u>seeming</u>	Appearing to be real or true, but not necessarily being so; apparent. <i>An angry seeming man.</i>
<u>semblance</u>	Resemblance similarity. <i>It bears some semblance to the thing I have in mind.</i>
unprepossessing	Not attractive or appealing to the eye. <i>Despite his unprepossessing appearance he had an animal magnetism.</i>
<u>veneer</u>	Cover with veneer. <i>Factories employed cabinetmakers to veneer looking glasses.</i>
