### Definitions of "Factory" as a noun

- *A building or group of buildings where goods are manufactured or assembled chiefly by machine.*
- *A plant consisting of one or more buildings with facilities for manufacturing.*
- *An establishment for traders carrying on business in a foreign country.*
- *A person or organization that continually produces a great quantity of something specified.*

<b>business unit</b>	A commercial or industrial enterprise and the people who constitute it.
<b>manufactory</b>	A plant consisting of one or more buildings with facilities for manufacturing.
<b>manufacturing complex</b>	The act of making something (a product) from raw materials.
<b>manufacturing facility</b>	The act of making something (a product) from raw materials.
<b>manufacturing plant</b>	The act of making something (a product) from raw materials.
<b>mill</b>	The act of grinding to a powder or dust. <i>A <b>mill</b> town.</i>
<b>plant</b>	A small plant as distinct from a shrub or tree. <i>Inadequate investment in new <b>plant</b>.</i>
<b>works</b>	The internal mechanism of a device. <i>The reward for good <b>works</b>.</i>

## yard

A square or cubic yard especially of sand or other building materials.

*It cost two hundred up front one **yard** for Maurice one for the girl.*

<b>arable</b>	Arable land or crops. <i>Open <b>arable</b> fields.</i>
<b>brewery</b>	A place where beer is made commercially. <i>Work continued on the new lager <b>brewery</b> in Alton.</i>
<b>cannery</b>	A factory where food is canned.
<b>create</b>	Create or manufacture a man made product. <i>He was <b>created</b> a baronet.</i>
<b>distillery</b>	A place where spirits are manufactured. <i>Scotland s southernmost malt <b>distillery</b>.</i>
<b>drinking</b>	The act of drinking alcoholic beverages to excess. <i>He was ordered to cut down his <b>drinking</b>.</i>
<b>fabrication</b>	An invention; a lie. <i>The synthesis and <b>fabrication</b> of single crystals.</i>

<b>fecund</b>	Producing many new ideas. <i>Her <b>fecund</b> imagination.</i>
<b>fecundity</b>	The state of being fertile; capable of producing offspring. <i>The immense <b>fecundity</b> of his imagination made a profound impact on European literature.</i>
<b>fertile</b>	Marked by great fruitfulness. <i>The <b>fertile</b> coastal plain.</i>
<b>figment</b>	A thing that someone believes to be real but that exists only in their imagination. <i>A <b>figment</b> of the imagination.</i>
<b>foundry</b>	A workshop or factory for casting metal.
<b>fructify</b>	Make (something) fruitful or productive. <i>They were sacrificed in order that their blood might <b>fructify</b> the crops.</i>
<b>fruitful</b>	Producing good or helpful results; productive. <i>This seed will grow into a lovely <b>fruitful</b> tree.</i>
<b>gin</b>	Separate the seeds from cotton with a cotton gin. <i><b>Gin</b> game.</i>
<b>industry</b>	Hard work. <i>The kitchen became a hive of <b>industry</b>.</i>
<b>liquor</b>	An alcoholic beverage that is distilled rather than fermented. <i>Waste <b>liquors</b>.</i>
<b>make</b>	Make by combining materials and parts. <i><b>Make</b> a move.</i>
<b>manufacture</b>	Manufactured articles. <i>Julia <b>manufactured</b> a smile.</i>
<b>manufacturer</b>	A person or company that makes goods for sale. <i>The <b>manufacturers</b> supply the goods to the distribution centre.</i>
<b>manufacturing</b>	The act of making something (a product) from raw materials. <i><b>Manufacturing</b> is vital to Great Britain.</i>
<b>mechanize</b>	Make mechanical. <i>If your work becomes too <b>mechanized</b> change jobs.</i>
<b>prevarication</b>	The deliberate act of deviating from the truth.
<b>produce</b>	Create or manufacture a man-made product. <i>The Bordeaux region <b>produces</b> great red wines.</i>
<b>producer</b>	A person responsible for the financial and managerial aspects of the making of a film or broadcast or for staging a play, opera, etc. <i>A record <b>producer</b>.</i>



<b>productive</b>	Producing or capable of producing (especially abundantly). A <b>productive</b> vineyard.
<b>prolific</b>	(of a sports player) high-scoring. A <b>prolific</b> pear tree.
<b>sawmill</b>	A mill for dressing logs and lumber.
<b>scotch</b>	A slight surface cut (especially a notch that is made to keep a tally). Feudal power in France was <b>scotched</b> though far from killed.
<b>tannery</b>	A place where animal hides are tanned; the workshop of a tanner.
