## Associations of "Fall apart" (30 Words)

<b><u>abate</u></b>	Make less active or intense. <i>The storm <b>abated</b>.</i>
<b><u>away</u></b>	Out of the way especially away from one's thoughts. <i>The Museum has shifted its emphasis <b>away</b> from research towards exhibitions.</i>
<b><u>collapse</u></b>	Collapse due to fatigue an illness or a sudden attack. <i>He had an operation to <b>collapse</b> his lung.</i>
<b>declension</b>	The class to which a noun or adjective is assigned according to the manner of this variation. <i>The <b>declension</b> of the new generation.</i>
<b>decline</b>	(in the grammar of Latin, Greek, and certain other languages) state the forms of (a noun, pronoun, or adjective) corresponding to case, number, and gender. <i>He <b>declined</b> to join the group on a hike.</i>
<b>declivity</b>	A downward slope. <i>A thickly wooded <b>declivity</b>.</i>
<b>decrease</b>	Decrease in size extent or range. <i>He <b>decreased</b> his staff.</i>
<b>descend</b>	Come as if by falling. <i>He was scrupulous in refusing to <b>descend</b> to misrepresentation.</i>
<b><u>descent</u></b>	A downward slope or bend. <i>His <b>descents</b> on the manager of any shop he took a fancy to visit.</i>
<b>deteriorate</b>	Become worse or disintegrate. <i>Her condition <b>deteriorated</b>.</i>
<b>diminish</b>	Make or become less. <i>The trial has aged and <b>diminished</b> him.</i>
<b><u>diminution</u></b>	Change toward something smaller or lower. <i>The disease shows no signs of <b>diminution</b>.</i>

<b>dive</b>	A shabby or sleazy bar or similar establishment. <i>He got into a fight in some <b>dive</b>.</i>
<b>downfall</b>	A sudden decline in strength or number or importance. <i>The crisis led to the <b>downfall</b> of the government.</i>
<b>downturn</b>	A decline in economic, business, or other activity. <i>The market took a <b>downturn</b>.</i>
<b>drop</b>	A section of theatrical scenery lowered from the flies a drop cloth or drop curtain. <i>Various guest DJs <b>drop</b> quality tunes both old and new.</i>
<b>far</b>	To an advanced stage or point. <i>The <b>far</b> north of Scotland.</i>
<b>going</b>	The act of departing. <i>Don't lose track of your child's comings and <b>goings</b>.</i>
<b>lessen</b>	Make or become less; diminish. <i>The warmth of the afternoon <b>lessened</b>.</i>
<b>mitigation</b>	The action of reducing the severity, seriousness, or painfulness of something. <i>The identification and <b>mitigation</b> of pollution.</i>
<b>plunge</b>	Fall abruptly. <i>For a moment the scene was illuminated then it was <b>plunged</b> back into darkness.</i>
<b>rundown</b>	A concluding summary (as in presenting a case before a law court). <i>He gave his teammates a <b>rundown</b> on the opposition.</i>
<b>slump</b>	A period of substantial failure or decline. <i>United <b>slumped</b> to another one nil defeat.</i>
<b>spill</b>	An instance of a liquid spilling or being spilt. <i>He had a nasty <b>spill</b> on the ice.</i>
<b>stray</b>	A stray person or thing especially a domestic animal. <i>Men who <b>stray</b> are seen as more exciting and desirable.</i>
<b>submerge</b>	Submerge. <i>Pellets were then <b>submersed</b> in agar.</i>
<b>subside</b>	Wear off or die down. <i>The mud <b>subsides</b> when the waters become calm.</i>
<b>topple</b>	Cause to topple or tumble by pushing. <i>The push almost <b>toppled</b> him to the ground.</i>
<b>tumble</b>	Dry washing in a tumble dryer. <i>The machine gently <b>tumbles</b> the clothes in cool air for ten minutes.</i>
