## Associations of "Fall by the wayside" (30 Words)

<b>abate</b>	Become less in amount or intensity. <i>This action would not have been sufficient to <b>abate</b> the odour nuisance.</i>
<b>abscise</b>	Shed flowers and leaves and fruit following formation of a scar tissue.
<b>allay</b>	Relieve or alleviate (pain or hunger). <i>The report attempted to educate the public and <b>allay</b> fears.</i>
<b>collapse</b>	Cause a lung or blood vessel to collapse. <i>The <b>collapse</b> of the old star under its own gravity.</i>
<b>declension</b>	(in the grammar of Latin, Greek, and certain other languages) the variation of the form of a noun, pronoun, or adjective, by which its grammatical case, number, and gender are identified. <i>This <b>declension</b> involves only two endings a nominative and an oblique.</i>
<b>decline</b>	A gradual and continuous loss of strength, numbers, quality, or value. <i>He died at his brother's of a deep <b>decline</b>.</i>
<b>declivity</b>	A downward slope. <i>A thickly wooded <b>declivity</b>.</i>
<b>decrease</b>	Decrease in size extent or range. <i>The rate of <b>decrease</b> became greater.</i>
<b>depletion</b>	Reduction in the number or quantity of something. <i>The <b>depletion</b> of the ozone layer.</i>
<b>descend</b>	Do something that one considers to be below one's dignity. <i>A flight of stairs <b>descended</b> a steep slope.</i>
<b>descent</b>	The transmission of qualities, property, or privileges by inheritance. <i>A steep badly eroded <b>descent</b>.</i>
<b>deteriorate</b>	Grow worse. <i>Relations between the countries had <b>deteriorated</b> sharply.</i>
<b>diminish</b>	Lessen the authority, dignity, or reputation of. <i>The pain will gradually <b>diminish</b>.</i>

<b>diminished</b>	Of an organ or body part diminished in size or strength as a result of disease or injury or lack of use. <i>A <b>diminished</b> fifth.</i>
<b>diminution</b>	The statement of a theme in notes of lesser duration (usually half the length of the original). <i>A permanent <b>diminution</b> in value.</i>
<b>down</b>	Downstairs. <i>She looked <b>down</b>.</i>
<b>downturn</b>	A worsening of business or economic activity. <i>A <b>downturn</b> in the housing market.</i>
<b>drop</b>	A section of theatrical scenery lowered from the flies a drop cloth or drop curtain. <i>He reckoned I <b>dropped</b> forty thousand pounds.</i>
<b>foliage</b>	Plant leaves collectively. <i>Healthy green <b>foliage</b>.</i>
<b>glide</b>	Fly in or as if in a glider plane. <i>A few gondolas <b>glided</b> past.</i>
<b>lessen</b>	Wear off or die down. <i>The warmth of the afternoon <b>lessened</b>.</i>
<b>rundown</b>	A reduction in the productivity or activities of a company or institution. <i>He gave his teammates a <b>rundown</b> on the opposition.</i>
<b>sink</b>	Cause a ship to sink. <i>You can relax on the veranda as the sun <b>sinks</b> low.</i>
<b>slump</b>	A long-term economic state characterized by unemployment and low prices and low levels of trade and investment. <i>The team went into a <b>slump</b>.</i>
<b>spill</b>	An instance of a liquid spilling or being spilt. <i>The former employee <b>spilled</b> all the details.</i>
<b>subside</b>	Descend into or as if into some soft substance or place. <i>She <b>subsided</b> into the chair.</i>
<b>topple</b>	Cause to topple or tumble by pushing. <i>She <b>toppled</b> over when I touched her.</i>
<b>tumble</b>	Dry washing in a tumble dryer. <i>The machine gently <b>tumbles</b> the clothes in cool air for ten minutes.</i>
<b>waning</b>	Pertaining to the period during which the visible surface of the moon decreases. <i>The waxing and <b>waning</b> of the moon.</i>
