## Associations of "Falling apart" (30 Words)

alone	Used to emphasize that only one factor out of several is being considered and that the whole is greater or more extreme. <i>She alone</i> believed him.
avulsion	A forcible tearing or surgical separation of one body part from another.
<u>away</u>	Out of the way especially away from one s thoughts. The teacher waved the children <b>away</b> from the dead animal.
cloistered	Kept away from the outside world; sheltered. A <b>cloistered</b> upbringing.
declension	The class to which a noun or adjective is assigned according to the manner of this variation. <i>This declension</i> involves only two endings a nominative and an oblique.
declivity	A downward slope. A thickly wooded <b>declivity</b> .
descend	Do something that one considers to be below one's dignity. Three hotels were granted the prestigious five star status whilst others <b>descend</b> ed in quality or maintained their ranking.
descending	Moving down a scale of quality. The categories are listed in <b>descending</b> order of usefulness.
<u>descent</u>	A moral, social, or psychological decline. The ancient empire s slow <b>descent</b> into barbarism.
detached	Being or feeling set or kept apart from others. A <b>detached</b> part.
dichotomous	Exhibiting or characterized by dichotomy. A <b>dichotomous</b> view of the world.
digressive	(of e.g. speech and writing) tending to depart from the main point or cover a wide range of subjects. A <b>digressive</b> account.



<u>down</u>	Bring down or defeat an opponent. <i>Our team is <b>down</b> by a run.</i>
	An instance of falling or dropping. It was a miracle that he survived the <b>drop</b> from that height.
fall	A waterfall or cascade. That strain again it had a dying <b>fall</b> .
Tar	Located at a great distance in time or space or degree. <i>Far</i> in the future.
farther	To or at a greater extent or degree or a more advanced stage further is used more often than farther in this abstract sense. <i>Farther</i> from the truth.
inaccessible	Unable to be reached. <i>Her unassailable <b>inaccessible</b> image.</i>
เทศเพาสมเพ	Apart from others. Dublin people dress more <b>individually</b> than people in London.
individuation	Discriminating the individual from the generic group or species.
ICUISTON	Remote and separate physically or socially. <i>Could not remain the <b>isolated</b> figure he had been.</i>
ICOLATION	A feeling of being disliked and alone. <b>Isolation</b> from family and friends may also contribute to anxiety.
	The act of dividing or partitioning separation by the creation of a boundary that divides or keeps apart. The cafe was divided up by glass <b>partition</b> s.
remote	A remote control device. <i>Remote stars.</i>
secluded	Providing privacy or seclusion. The gardens are quiet and <b>secluded</b> .
separated	Separated at the joint. The <b>separated</b> spacecraft will return to their home bases.
separately	Apart from others. They arrived together but left <b>separately</b> .
solitary	Devoid of creatures. A <b>solitary</b> walk.
splash	Mark or overlay with patches of contrasting color or texture cause to appear splashed or spattered. There s going to be a big <b>splash</b> when Mike returns to the ring.
