Associations of "Falling apart" (30 Words)

alone	Used to emphasize that only one factor out of several is being considered and that the whole is greater or more extreme. <i>She alone believed him.</i>
avulsion	A forcible tearing or surgical separation of one body part from another.
away	Out of the way especially away from one's thoughts. <i>The teacher waved the children away from the dead animal.</i>
cloistered	Kept away from the outside world; sheltered. <i>A cloistered upbringing.</i>
declension	The class to which a noun or adjective is assigned according to the manner of this variation. <i>This declension involves only two endings a nominative and an oblique.</i>
declivity	A downward slope. <i>A thickly wooded declivity.</i>
descend	Do something that one considers to be below one's dignity. <i>Three hotels were granted the prestigious five star status whilst others descended in quality or maintained their ranking.</i>
descending	Moving down a scale of quality. <i>The categories are listed in descending order of usefulness.</i>
descent	A moral, social, or psychological decline. <i>The ancient empire's slow descent into barbarism.</i>
detached	Being or feeling set or kept apart from others. <i>A detached part.</i>
dichotomous	Exhibiting or characterized by dichotomy. <i>A dichotomous view of the world.</i>
digressive	(of e.g. speech and writing) tending to depart from the main point or cover a wide range of subjects. <i>A digressive account.</i>

down	Bring down or defeat an opponent. <i>Our team is down by a run.</i>
drop	An instance of falling or dropping. <i>It was a miracle that he survived the drop from that height.</i>
fall	A waterfall or cascade. <i>That strain again it had a dying fall.</i>
far	Located at a great distance in time or space or degree. <i>Far in the future.</i>
farther	To or at a greater extent or degree or a more advanced stage further is used more often than farther in this abstract sense. <i>Farther from the truth.</i>
inaccessible	Unable to be reached. <i>Her unassailable inaccessible image.</i>
individually	Apart from others. <i>Dublin people dress more individually than people in London.</i>
individuation	Discriminating the individual from the generic group or species.
isolated	Remote and separate physically or socially. <i>Could not remain the isolated figure he had been.</i>
isolation	A feeling of being disliked and alone. <i>Isolation from family and friends may also contribute to anxiety.</i>
partition	The act of dividing or partitioning separation by the creation of a boundary that divides or keeps apart. <i>The cafe was divided up by glass partitions.</i>
remote	A remote control device. <i>Remote stars.</i>
secluded	Providing privacy or seclusion. <i>The gardens are quiet and secluded.</i>
separated	Separated at the joint. <i>The separated spacecraft will return to their home bases.</i>
separately	Apart from others. <i>They arrived together but left separately.</i>
solitary	Devoid of creatures. <i>A solitary walk.</i>
splash	Mark or overlay with patches of contrasting color or texture cause to appear splashed or spattered. <i>There s going to be a big splash when Mike returns to the ring.</i>
