acquaintance	Acquaintances considered collectively. <i>His extensive acquaintance included Oscar Wilde and Yeats.</i>
acquainted	Having fair knowledge of. <i>They were acquainted.</i>
adept	Very skilled or proficient at something. <i>She is adept at cutting through red tape.</i>
adroit	Quick or skillful or adept in action or thought. <i>An exceptionally adroit pianist.</i>
affair	Business and financial dealings. <i>I wanted the funeral to be a family affair.</i>
ambient	Relating to ambient music. <i>The liquid is stored at below ambient temperature.</i>
around	All around or on all sides. <i>Weights around a hundred pounds.</i>
close	Close in relevance or relationship. <i>My business closes every night at 8 P M.</i>
closely	In a careful and attentive way. <i>Closely spaced homes.</i>
closeness	The quality of being done in an attentive and thorough way. <i>Their closeness grew as the night wore on.</i>
connected	Stored in, controlled by, or in direct communication with a central computer. <i>First check to see whether the appliance is connected.</i>
conversant	Well informed about or knowing thoroughly. <i>Conversant with business trends.</i>
deft	Demonstrating skill and cleverness. <i>A deft piece of footwork.</i>

dexterous	Showing or having skill, especially with the hands. <i>A dexterous keyboard player.</i>
dextrous	Skillful in physical movements; especially of the hands.
experienced	Having experience; having knowledge or skill from observation or participation. <i>She was experienced in marketing.</i>
extraordinarily	In a very unusual or remarkable way. <i>It is a simple story extraordinarily well told.</i>
familiarity	Usualness by virtue of being familiar or well known. <i>His familiarity with the works of Thomas Hardy.</i>
familiarly	In an intimately familiar manner.
informed	Having much knowledge or education. <i>The informed customer.</i>
intimacy	Close or warm friendship. <i>He acquired an intimacy with Swahili literature.</i>
intimate	Imply as a possibility. <i>They are on intimate terms.</i>
intimately	In a private and personal way. <i>The two phenomena are intimately connected.</i>
involvement	The condition of sharing in common with others (as fellows or partners etc). <i>He escaped involvement in the accident.</i>
know	Know how to do or perform something. <i>A man who had known better times.</i>
prevailing	Most frequent or common. <i>Prevailing winds.</i>
proficient	A person who is proficient. <i>He became a proficient in Latin and Greek.</i>
skillful	Done with delicacy and skill. <i>A lesser known but no less skillful composer.</i>
sociality	The tendency to associate with others and to form social groups. <i>Mammals as a class are not strong on sociality.</i>
tactful	Showing skill and sensitivity in dealing with people. <i>She was tactful enough not to shatter his illusion.</i>
