rareness Noteworthy scarcity.
ravenousness Excessive desire to eat.

scantiness The quality of being meager.

Problems because of the **scantiness** of reliable information.

scarcity The state of being scarce or in short supply; shortage.

The growing **scarcity** of resources.

scarcity of food A small and inadequate amount.

A state or situation in which something needed cannot be obtained in

shortage sufficient amounts.
