povertyThe state of being inferior in quality or insufficient in amount.

rareness Noteworthy scarcity.ravenousness Excessive desire to eat.

scantiness The quality of being meager.

Problems because of the scantiness of reliable information.

scarcity The state of being scarce or in short supply; shortage.

The growing **scarcity** of resources.

scarcity of food A small and inadequate amount.

A state or situation in which something needed cannot be obtained in

shortage sufficient amounts.
