- *Indulge in daydreaming about something desired.*

<b>conceptualize</b>	Have the idea for. <i>Sex was <b>conceptualized</b> as an overpowering force in the individual.</i>
<b>conjure up</b>	Engage in plotting or enter into a conspiracy, swear together.

**daydream**

Indulge in a daydream.

*She looked out the window **daydreaming**.*

Indulge in daydreams or fantasies about something greatly desired.

*This is not at all how she **dreamed** her baby's birthday was going to be.*

**envisage**

Form a mental picture of (something not yet existing or known).

*The Rome Treaty **envisaged** free movement across frontiers.*

[envision](#)

Picture to oneself; imagine possible.

*She **envisioned** the admiring glances of guests seeing her home.*

**fantasise**

Indulge in fantasies.

[fantasy](#)

Indulge in fantasies.

*It is ludicrous to **fantasy** disinventing the hydrogen bomb.*

**form a picture of**

Make something, usually for a specific function.

**give free rein to one's imagination**

Proffer (a body part).

[imagine](#)

Form a mental image of something that is not present or that is not the case.

*I **imagine** she earned a lot of money with her new novel.*

**indulge in fancy**

Give free rein to.

**indulge in fantasy**

Enjoy to excess.

**indulge in wool-gathering**

Yield (to); give satisfaction to.

**live in a dream world**

Have life, be alive.

Reflect deeply on a subject.

**picture**

Show in or as in a picture.

*She **pictured** Benjamin waiting.*

[pretend](#)

Represent fictitiously as in a play or pretend to be or act like.

*He cannot **pretend** to sophistication.*

**see in the mind's eye**

Observe, check out, and look over carefully or inspect.

[visualize](#)

Form a mental image of; imagine.

*The radiologist can **visualize** the cancerous liver.*

## Usage Examples of "Fantasize" as a verb

- *One might fantasize the death of someone seen as a threat.*
- *He sometimes fantasized about emigrating.*
