<u>approximate</u>	Located close together. The approximate time was 10 o clock.
approximately	Imprecise but fairly close to correct. <i>Lasted</i> approximately an hour.
approximation	The act of bringing near or bringing together especially the cut edges of tissue. Newspapers gave only an approximation of the actual events.
approximative	(of a method, description, etc.) giving only an approximation to something. <i>A crudely approximative outline.</i>
around	All around or on all sides. Frigid weather the year around .
broadly	In a wide fashion. <i>He interprets the law broadly.</i>
<u>closely</u>	In a careful and attentive way. The real world injuries closely mirrored the university s experimental data.
<u>closeness</u>	The quality of being done in an attentive and thorough way. Their closeness grew as the night wore on.
contiguous	Next or together in sequence. The Southern Ocean is contiguous with the Atlantic.
equidistant	The same distance apart at every point. The line joins together all points which are equidistant from the two axes.



<u>further</u>	In addition or furthermore. Wages have been driven down even further .	
least	Used in names of very small animals and plants e g least shrew. He had a knack for showing up when he was least expected.	
little	Small and of little importance. <i>He reminded me a little of my parents.</i>	
locality	An area or neighbourhood. <i>It is a rugged locality.</i>	
locally	By a particular locality. The service control function is installed locally .	
more	Forming the comparative of adjectives and adverbs especially those of more than one syllable. <i>We have no more bananas.</i>	
near	Located on the nearside of a vehicle. My sisters and brothers are near and dear.	
<u>nearby</u>	Close by. The nearby towns.	
<u>nearly</u>	(of actions or states) slightly short of or not quite accomplished; all but. A rise of nearly 25 per cent.	
neighboring	Having a common boundary or edge; abutting; touching. <i>Neighboring</i> cities.	
perigee	Periapsis in Earth orbit; the point in its orbit where a satellite is nearest to the Earth.	
perihelion	Periapsis in solar orbit; the point in the orbit of a planet or comet where it is nearest to the sun. <i>Today Mercury is at perihelion</i> .	
proximate	Nearly accurate approximate. News of his proximate arrival.	
<u>proximity</u>	A Gestalt principle of organization holding that (other things being equal) objects or events that are near to one another (in space or time) are perceived as belonging together as a unit. Do not operate microphones in close proximity to television sets.	
<u>roughly</u>	With roughness or violence rough is an informal variant for roughly. The narrative is roughly speaking contemporary with the earliest of the gospels.	
<u>some</u>	To some extent quite a lot. That was some party.

vicinity	The area near or surrounding a particular place. The plane crashed in the vicinity of Asheville.
