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Associations of "Far and few between" (30 Words)

about	(of quantities) imprecise but fairly close to correct. <i>There was a lot of flu about.</i>
<u>almost</u>	(of actions or states) slightly short of or not quite accomplished; all but. <i>Blues jazz he can play almost anything.</i>
<u>approximate</u>	Located close together. <i>The approximate time was 10 o'clock.</i>
approximately	Imprecise but fairly close to correct. <i>Lasted approximately an hour.</i>
approximation	The act of bringing near or bringing together especially the cut edges of tissue. <i>Newspapers gave only an approximation of the actual events.</i>
approximative	(of a method, description, etc.) giving only an approximation to something. <i>A crudely approximative outline.</i>
around	All around or on all sides. <i>Frigid weather the year around.</i>
<u>broadly</u>	In a wide fashion. <i>He interprets the law broadly.</i>
<u>closely</u>	In a careful and attentive way. <i>The real world injuries closely mirrored the university's experimental data.</i>
<u>closeness</u>	The quality of being done in an attentive and thorough way. <i>Their closeness grew as the night wore on.</i>
contiguous	Next or together in sequence. <i>The Southern Ocean is contiguous with the Atlantic.</i>
equidistant	The same distance apart at every point. <i>The line joins together all points which are equidistant from the two axes.</i>

<u>further</u>	In addition or furthermore. <i>Wages have been driven down even further.</i>
least	Used in names of very small animals and plants e g least shrew. <i>He had a knack for showing up when he was least expected.</i>
little	Small and of little importance. <i>He reminded me a little of my parents.</i>
locality	An area or neighbourhood. <i>It is a rugged locality.</i>
locally	By a particular locality. <i>The service control function is installed locally.</i>
more	Forming the comparative of adjectives and adverbs especially those of more than one syllable. <i>We have no more bananas.</i>
near	Located on the nearside of a vehicle. <i>My sisters and brothers are near and dear.</i>
<u>nearby</u>	Close by. <i>The nearby towns.</i>
<u>nearly</u>	(of actions or states) slightly short of or not quite accomplished; all but. <i>A rise of nearly 25 per cent.</i>
neighboring	Having a common boundary or edge; abutting; touching. <i>Neighboring cities.</i>
perigee	Periapsis in Earth orbit; the point in its orbit where a satellite is nearest to the Earth.
perihelion	Periapsis in solar orbit; the point in the orbit of a planet or comet where it is nearest to the sun. <i>Today Mercury is at perihelion.</i>
proximate	Nearly accurate approximate. <i>News of his proximate arrival.</i>
<u>proximity</u>	A Gestalt principle of organization holding that (other things being equal) objects or events that are near to one another (in space or time) are perceived as belonging together as a unit. <i>Do not operate microphones in close proximity to television sets.</i>
<u>roughly</u>	With roughness or violence rough is an informal variant for roughly. <i>The narrative is roughly speaking contemporary with the earliest of the gospels.</i>
<u>some</u>	To some extent quite a lot. <i>That was some party.</i>

throughout

Used to refer to cited works.

*The house is in good order **throughout**.*

vicinity

The area near or surrounding a particular place.

*The plane crashed in the **vicinity** of Asheville.*
