Associations of "Far cry definition" (30 Words)

bawl	Cry loudly. <i>He addressed every class in a terrifying bawl.</i>
bellow	Sing (a song) loudly and tunelessly. <i>Not sausage and mash again he bellowed.</i>
complain	Express complaints discontent displeasure or unhappiness. <i>My mother complains all day.</i>
creak	Make a high-pitched, screeching noise. <i>The stairs creaked as she went up them.</i>
gripe	Secure a boat with gripes. <i>I have a gripe about the service here.</i>
grouse	Hunt grouse.
growl	The sound of growling as made by animals. <i>The growl of diesel engines.</i>
holler	A very loud utterance (like the sound of an animal). <i>He hollers when he wants feeding.</i>
howl	Make a howling sound. <i>They howled me down and called me a chauvinist.</i>
howling	Filled with or characterized by howling. <i>The howling wilderness.</i>
lamentation	The passionate and demonstrative activity of expressing grief. <i>Scenes of lamentation.</i>
outcry	Shout louder than. <i>An outcry of spontaneous passion.</i>
plaintive	Sounding sad and mournful. <i>A plaintive cry.</i>
screech	Make a high pitched screeching noise. <i>The van screeched round a bend at speed.</i>

<u>shout</u>	Prevent someone from speaking or being heard by shouting. <i>His words were interrupted by warning shouts.</i>
shriek	Be very obvious or strikingly discordant. <i>The patterned carpets shrieked at Blanche from the shabby store.</i>
<u>shrill</u>	Speak or cry with a shrill voice. <i>Shrill</i> criticism.
sniffle	Cry or whine with snuffling. <i>She had a slight cough and a sniffle.</i>
snivel	An act or sound of snivelling. <i>Stop snivelling you got yourself into this mess.</i>
sob	An act or sound of sobbing. <i>I thought they'd killed you he sobbed weakly.</i>
squawk	The noise of squawking. <i>The geese flew upriver squawking.</i>
squeak	A short, high-pitched sound or cry. <i>I didn't hear a squeak from him for months.</i>
<u>squeal</u>	Make a squeal. <i>Don't you dare she squealed.</i>
uncommitted	Not bound or pledged. <i>There is very little uncommitted money to fund new policies.</i>
wail	Utter a wail. <i>Christopher let out a wail.</i>
<u>weep</u>	A fit or period of weeping. <i>Sit down and have a weep.</i>
<u>whimper</u>	A whimpering sound. <i>A child in a bed nearby began to whimper.</i>
whine	A complaint uttered in a plaintive whining way. <i>There was a hint of a whine in Anna's voice.</i>
whinny	Of a horse make a whinny. <i>The pony whinnied and tossed his head happily.</i>
<u>yell</u>	Shout in a loud, sharp way. <i>Her foot slipped and she gave a yell of fear.</i>
