Associations of "Far fetched" (30 Words)

apart	Not taken into account or excluded from consideration. <i>Joking apart they do a really remarkable job.</i>
astray	Away from the right path or direction. <i>A bullet went astray and killed a bystander.</i>
away	An away match or win. <i>Away fans chanted and cheered.</i>
bounce	Hit something so that it bounces. <i>Those who put in a dismal performance will be bounced from the tour.</i>
constellation	A group of stars forming a recognizable pattern that is traditionally named after its apparent form or identified with a mythological figure. <i>No two patients ever show exactly the same constellation of symptoms.</i>
detached	Being or feeling set or kept apart from others. <i>A four bedroomed detached house.</i>
distant	(after a measurement) at a specified distance. <i>Distant lands.</i>
farther	To or at a greater distance in time or space farther is used more frequently than further in this physical sense. <i>The practice may go back still farther to the Druids.</i>
forth	From a particular thing or place or position forth is obsolete. <i>From that time forth.</i>
further	To or at a greater extent or degree or a more advanced stage further is used more often than farther in this abstract sense. <i>For some time I had wanted to move further from London.</i>
galaxy	The galaxy of which the solar system is a part the Milky Way. <i>The four musicians have played with a galaxy of stars.</i>
going	(of a price) accepted or usual at the current time. <i>Persuading him was easy going.</i>

inaccessible	Unable to be used. <i>A rare work today almost inaccessible.</i>
isolated	Being or feeling set or kept apart from others. <i>An isolated pawn.</i>
leap	A thing to be leaped over or from. <i>A leap of 75 per cent in two years.</i>
mile	A former British unit of length equivalent to 6 080 feet 1 853 184 meters 800 feet longer than a statute mile. <i>This is my favourite film by a mile.</i>
out-of-town	The people living in a municipality smaller than a city.
outback	Inaccessible and sparsely populated. <i>A two week tour of the outback.</i>
outlying	Relatively far from a center or middle. <i>Outlying settlements.</i>
outpost	A small military camp or position at some distance from the main army, used especially as a guard against surprise attack. <i>A few scattered outposts along the west coast.</i>
outside	Functioning outside the boundaries or precincts of an organized unit. <i>We ran outside.</i>
remote	A remote control device. <i>She seemed remote and patronizing.</i>
secluded	Providing privacy or seclusion. <i>A secluded romantic spot.</i>
separated	Separated at the joint. <i>The separated spacecraft will return to their home bases.</i>
separately	As a separate entity or entities; not together. <i>They arrived together but left separately.</i>
solitary	Lacking companions or companionship. <i>A man of a solitary disposition.</i>
stray	An animal that has strayed especially a domestic animal. <i>Stray capacitance.</i>
underpopulated	Having a lower population density than normal or desirable. <i>The richly endowed but underpopulated Ivory Coast.</i>
upstage	Move upstage forcing the other actors to turn away from the audience. <i>This upstage reserve is rather ridiculous.</i>
yon	Distant but within sight yon is dialectal. <i>The house yonder.</i>
