## Associations of "Far fetched" (30 Words)

<a href="#">apart</a>	Not taken into account or excluded from consideration. <i>Joking <b>apart</b> they do a really remarkable job.</i>
<a href="#">astray</a>	Away from the right path or direction. <i>A bullet went <b>astray</b> and killed a bystander.</i>
<a href="#">away</a>	An away match or win. <i><b>Away</b> fans chanted and cheered.</i>
<b>bounce</b>	Hit something so that it bounces. <i>Those who put in a dismal performance will be <b>bounced</b> from the tour.</i>
<a href="#">constellation</a>	A group of stars forming a recognizable pattern that is traditionally named after its apparent form or identified with a mythological figure. <i>No two patients ever show exactly the same <b>constellation</b> of symptoms.</i>
<b>detached</b>	Being or feeling set or kept apart from others. <i>A four bedroomed <b>detached</b> house.</i>
<a href="#">distant</a>	(after a measurement) at a specified distance. <i><b>Distant</b> lands.</i>
<b>farther</b>	To or at a greater distance in time or space farther is used more frequently than further in this physical sense. <i>The practice may go back still <b>farther</b> to the Druids.</i>
<b>forth</b>	From a particular thing or place or position forth is obsolete. <i>From that time <b>forth</b>.</i>
<a href="#">further</a>	To or at a greater extent or degree or a more advanced stage further is used more often than farther in this abstract sense. <i>For some time I had wanted to move <b>further</b> from London.</i>
<a href="#">galaxy</a>	The galaxy of which the solar system is a part the Milky Way. <i>The four musicians have played with a <b>galaxy</b> of stars.</i>
<a href="#">going</a>	(of a price) accepted or usual at the current time. <i>Persuading him was easy <b>going</b>.</i>

<b>inaccessible</b>	Unable to be used. <i>A rare work today almost <b>inaccessible</b>.</i>
<b>isolated</b>	Being or feeling set or kept apart from others. <i>An <b>isolated</b> pawn.</i>
<b>leap</b>	A thing to be leaped over or from. <i>A <b>leap</b> of 75 per cent in two years.</i>
<b>mile</b>	A former British unit of length equivalent to 6 080 feet 1 853 184 meters 800 feet longer than a statute mile. <i>This is my favourite film by a <b>mile</b>.</i>
<b>out-of-town</b>	The people living in a municipality smaller than a city.
<b>outback</b>	Inaccessible and sparsely populated. <i>A two week tour of the <b>outback</b>.</i>
<b>outlying</b>	Relatively far from a center or middle. <i><b>Outlying</b> settlements.</i>
<b>outpost</b>	A small military camp or position at some distance from the main army, used especially as a guard against surprise attack. <i>A few scattered <b>outposts</b> along the west coast.</i>
<b>outside</b>	Functioning outside the boundaries or precincts of an organized unit. <i>We ran <b>outside</b>.</i>
<b>remote</b>	A remote control device. <i>She seemed <b>remote</b> and patronizing.</i>
<b>secluded</b>	Providing privacy or seclusion. <i>A <b>secluded</b> romantic spot.</i>
<b>separated</b>	Separated at the joint. <i>The <b>separated</b> spacecraft will return to their home bases.</i>
<b>separately</b>	As a separate entity or entities; not together. <i>They arrived together but left <b>separately</b>.</i>
<b>solitary</b>	Lacking companions or companionship. <i>A man of a <b>solitary</b> disposition.</i>
<b>stray</b>	An animal that has strayed especially a domestic animal. <i><b>Stray</b> capacitance.</i>
<b>underpopulated</b>	Having a lower population density than normal or desirable. <i>The richly endowed but <b>underpopulated</b> Ivory Coast.</i>
<b>upstage</b>	Move upstage forcing the other actors to turn away from the audience. <i>This <b>upstage</b> reserve is rather ridiculous.</i>
<b>yon</b>	Distant but within sight yon is dialectal. <i>The house <b>yonder</b>.</i>
