apart	Having characteristics not shared by others- Vannever Bush. <i>Studies from as far apart as America and Iceland.</i>
area	A particular environment or walk of life. <i>The room is twelve square feet in area.</i>
arrival	A person who has arrived somewhere. <i>Ruth s arrival in New York.</i>
astray	Far from the intended target. <i>A bullet went astray and killed a bystander.</i>
away	Out of the way especially away from one s thoughts. <i>The wedding is only weeks away.</i>
constellation	A configuration of stars as seen from the earth. <i>No two patients ever show exactly the same constellation of symptoms.</i>
distal	Situated farthest from point of attachment or origin, as of a limb or bone. <i>The distal end of the tibia.</i>
distant	(after a measurement) at a specified distance. <i>The star is 30 000 light years distant from Earth.</i>
eventually	In the end, especially after a long delay, dispute, or series of problems. <i>Eventually after midnight I arrived at the hotel.</i>
expanse	A wide and open space or area as of surface or land or sky. <i>The moth has a wing expanse of 20 to 24 mm.</i>
farther	To or at a greater extent or degree or a more advanced stage further is used more often than farther in this abstract sense. <i>Farther from our expectations.</i>
finally	In such a way as to put an end to doubt and dispute. <i>Finally it is common knowledge that travel broadens the horizons.</i>
forth	From a particular thing or place or position forth is obsolete. <i>Go forth and preach.</i>

further	To or at a greater extent or degree or a more advanced stage further is used more often than farther in this abstract sense. <i>Wages have been driven down even further.</i>
galaxy	The galaxy of which the solar system is a part the Milky Way. <i>Extragalactic nebula is a former name for galaxy.</i>
inaccessible	(of a person) not open to advances or influence; unapproachable. <i>The city centre is inaccessible to traffic in most places.</i>
isle	An island or peninsula, especially a small one. <i>Crusoe s fabled isle.</i>
location	A position or address in computer memory. <i>They shot the film on location in Nevada.</i>
mile	A former British unit of length equivalent to 6 080 feet 1 853 184 meters 800 feet longer than a statute mile. <i>He missed by a mile.</i>
outback	Any remote or sparsely populated inland region. <i>The outback of Ontario.</i>
outlying	Relatively far from a center or middle. <i>Outlying settlements.</i>
outpost	A military post stationed at a distance from the main body of troops. <i>A few scattered outposts along the west coast.</i>
remote	A remote control device. <i>A second feature allows pagers to be alerted from remote alarm sensors.</i>
scope	A telescope microscope or other device having a name ending in scope. <i>They d scoped out their market.</i>
secluded	(of a place) not seen or visited by many people; sheltered and private. <i>A secluded romantic spot.</i>
solitary	Single; only. <i>Tigers are essentially solitary.</i>
stray	A stray person or thing especially a domestic animal. <i>Dog owners are urged not to allow their dogs to stray.</i>
ultimately	Finally; in the end. <i>The largest firms may ultimately become unstoppable.</i>
underpopulated	Having a lower population density than normal or desirable. <i>The richly endowed but underpopulated Ivory Coast.</i>
yon	At or in an indicated usually distant place yon is archaic and dialectal. <i>Scattered here and yon.</i>
