- agronomist** An expert in soil management and field-crop production.

- agronomy** The science of soil management and crop production.

- rustic** An unsophisticated country person.  
***Rustic** capitals were much easier to form.*
- uncultivated** Not prepared for raising crops.  
*These meadowlands have lain **uncultivated** for centuries.*
- villager** A person who lives in a village.  
*Angry **villagers** have been forced to leave flooded areas.*
- yeoman** A member of the yeomanry force.
