<u>entrancing</u>	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>Antique papers of entrancing design.</i>
<u>gripping</u>	Firmly holding the attention or interest; exciting. <i>A gripping TV thriller.</i>
interesting	Arousing curiosity or interest; holding or catching the attention. <i>It will be very interesting to see what they come up with.</i>
<u>mesmerizing</u>	Attracting and holding interest as if by a spell. <i>The sheer force of his presence was mesmerizing.</i>
<u>riveting</u>	Completely engrossing; compelling. <i>The book is a riveting account of the legendary freedom fighter.</i>
spellbinding	Holding one's attention completely as though by magic; fascinating. <i>A spellbinding description of life in ancient Rome.</i>
<u>thrilling</u>	Causing quivering or shivering as by cold or fear or electric shock. <i>A thrilling performer to watch.</i>

entrancing	Capable of attracting and holding interest; charming. <i>I find you entrancing.</i>
exciting	Stimulating interest and discussion. <i>An exciting novel.</i>
fascinated	Strongly attracted and interested. <i>A crowd of fascinated onlookers.</i>
funny	A joke or witty remark. <i>She told a funny story.</i>
interesting	Arousing curiosity or interest; holding or catching the attention. <i>It will be very interesting to see what they come up with.</i>
intriguing	Capable of arousing interest or curiosity. <i>The food is an intriguing combination of German and French.</i>
irresistible	Impossible to resist; overpowering. <i>Irresistible or resistless impulses.</i>
irresistibly	In a way that is too attractive and tempting to be resisted. <i>Men are irresistibly attracted to her.</i>
overwhelming	Very great in amount. <i>She felt an overwhelming desire to giggle.</i>
riveting	Completely engrossing; compelling. <i>The book is a riveting account of the legendary freedom fighter.</i>
salient	Represented as leaping (rampant but leaning forward). <i>The salient object in my view.</i>
sensational	Causing great public interest and excitement. <i>You look sensational.</i>
spectacular	Characteristic of spectacles or drama. <i>Spectacular mountain scenery.</i>
stardom	The state or status of being a very famous or talented entertainer or sports player. <i>Stardom meant nothing to her.</i>
striking	The action of striking. <i>Striking mineworkers.</i>

super

Superfine fabric or manufacture.
