- *The state of being intensely interested (as by awe or terror).*
- *A feeling of great liking for something wonderful and unusual.*



Synonyms of "Fascination" as a noun (8 Words)

captivation	A feeling of great liking for something wonderful and unusual.
<u>compulsion</u>	An irresistible urge to behave in a certain way. <i>Her compulsion to wash her hands repeatedly.</i>
<u>enchantment</u>	The state of being under a spell; magic. <i>A world of mystery and enchantment.</i>
enthralment	A feeling of great liking for something wonderful and unusual.
interest	The selfish pursuit of one's own welfare self interest. <i>They have interests all over the world.</i>
<u>obsession</u>	An unhealthy and compulsive preoccupation with something or someone. <i>She cared for him with a devotion bordering on obsession.</i>
passion	A strong feeling or emotion. <i>A man of impetuous passion.</i>
<u>preoccupation</u>	An idea that preoccupies the mind and holds the attention. <i>His preoccupation with politics.</i>

- *He had a lifelong fascination with science.*
- *He held the children spellbound with magic tricks and other fascinations.*

<u>adorable</u>	Inspiring great affection or delight. <i>I have four adorable Siamese cats.</i>
aesthetically	In a tasteful way. <i>This building is aesthetically very pleasing.</i>
alluring	Highly attractive and able to arouse hope or desire. <i>An alluring prospect.</i>
appealing	Able to attract interest or draw favorable attention. <i>Village life is somehow more appealing.</i>
attractive	Having the properties of a magnet; the ability to draw or pull. <i>An attractive village.</i>
beautifully	Very well; excellently. <i>She does sing beautifully.</i>
bewitchment	A magical spell.
<u>charm</u>	Protect through supernatural powers or charms. <i>Inscribed around its base is a charm in Balinese.</i>

<u>charming</u>	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers. <i>He was a charming affectionate colleague.</i>
<u>comely</u>	Pleasant to look at; attractive (typically used of a woman). <i>A comely face.</i>
cute	Attractive especially by means of smallness or prettiness or quaintness. <i>The two brothers were cute enough to find a couple of rich women and marry them.</i>
dote	A sweet or adorable person. <i>Rose was married to a dote of a fella.</i>
<u>enchancing</u>	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>Enchancing music.</i>
<u>enchantment</u>	The state of being under a spell; magic. <i>The enchantment of the mountains.</i>
engaging	Charming and attractive. <i>An engaging frankness.</i>
enthralling	Capturing and holding one's attention; fascinating. <i>An enthralling best seller.</i>
enticing	Attractive or tempting; alluring. <i>Difficult to say no to an enticing advertisement.</i>
<u>entrancing</u>	Capable of attracting and holding interest; charming. <i>I find you entrancing.</i>
glamorize	Interpret romantically. <i>The lyrics glamorize drugs.</i>
gorgeous	Very pleasant or enjoyable. <i>A gorgeous Victorian gown.</i>
intriguing	Disturbingly provocative. <i>Our team came up with some most intriguing finds.</i>
<u>inviting</u>	Offering the promise of an attractive or enjoyable experience. <i>The sea down there looks so inviting.</i>
<u>obsessive</u>	A person who has obsessions. <i>Obsessive gambling.</i>
<u>personable</u>	(of a person) having a pleasant appearance and manner. <i>She is quite a personable young woman.</i>
<u>photogenic</u>	(especially of a person) looking attractive in photographs or on film. <i>A photogenic child.</i>

revulsion	The drawing of disease or blood congestion from one part of the body to another, e.g. by counterirritation. <i>News of the attack will be met with sorrow and revulsion.</i>
seductive	Tending to entice into a desired action or state. <i>A seductive voice.</i>
stunning	Extremely impressive or attractive. <i>Quite stunning with large dark eyes and a beautiful high bosomed figure.</i>
tempting	Highly attractive and able to arouse hope or desire. <i>It is often tempting to bring about change rapidly.</i>
winsome	Charming in a childlike or naive way. <i>A winsome smile.</i>
