Quantifier; used with either mass or count nouns to indicate the whole number or amount of or every one of a class.

in fashion

Currently fashionable.

in vogue

Currently fashionable.

modern

Belonging to the modern era since the Middle Ages.
*Matisse's contribution to **modern** art.*

modish

In the current fashion or style.
*It seems sad that such a scholar should feel compelled to use this **modish** jargon.*

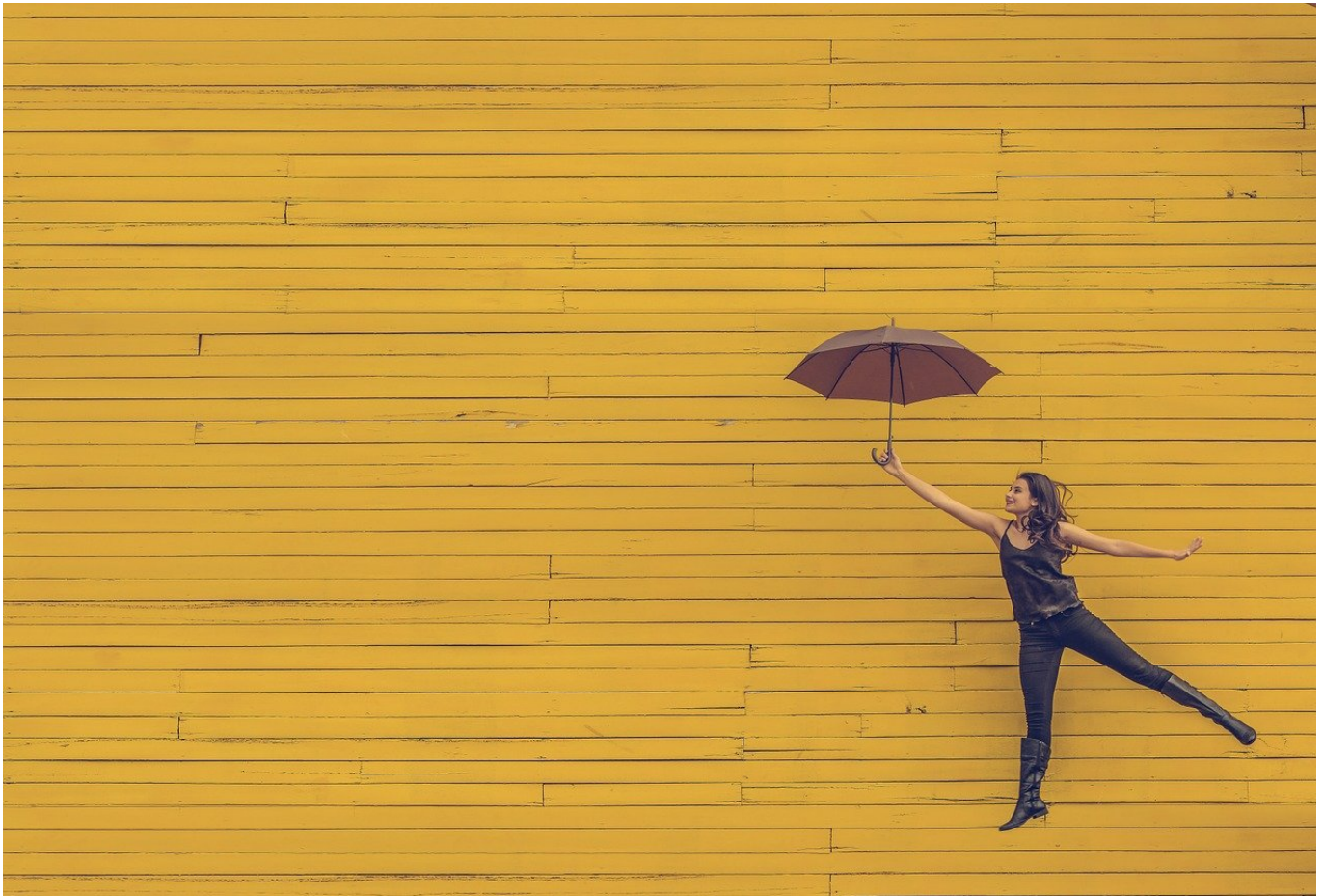
popular

(of music or art) new and of general appeal (especially among young people).
*The **popular** vote.*

stylish

Being or in accordance with current social fashions.
*The **stylish** resort of Gstaad.*

trendsetting	Initiating or popularizing a trend.
up to date	Extending or moving toward a higher place.
up to the minute	Getting higher or more vigorous.
voguish	Popular or in fashion at a particular time. <i>Mermaid chic is very voguish this season.</i>

abreast	Side by side and facing the same way. <i>Keeping abreast of developments.</i>
alongside	Side by side.
chic	Elegance by virtue of being fashionable. <i>The hotel s lobby and restaurant are the height of designer chic.</i>
craze	State of violent mental agitation. <i>Crazed by hunger the population began to turn on the rebels.</i>
current	A flow of electricity through a conductor. <i>The current topic.</i>
dapper	Neat and trim in dress and appearance (typically used of a man). <i>A dapper young man.</i>
fad	An arbitrary like or dislike. <i>His fads about the type of coffee he must have.</i>

faddish	Intensely fashionable or popular for a short period of time. <i>Tastes in flavoured coffee are so faddish.</i>
fashion	Use materials to produce (something). <i>The latest Parisian fashions.</i>
inimitable	So good or unusual as to be impossible to copy; unique. <i>An inimitable style.</i>
jaunty	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. <i>A jaunty red hat.</i>
lately	Recently; not long ago. <i>Lately the rules have been enforced.</i>
latest	Up to the immediate present; most recent or most up-to-date. <i>The latest news.</i>
modern	Belonging to the modern era since the Middle Ages. <i>They do not have modern weapons.</i>
modish	Conforming to or following what is currently popular and fashionable. <i>It seems sad that such a scholar should feel compelled to use this modish jargon.</i>
natty	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. <i>A natty blue blazer.</i>
newfangled	(of a new kind or fashion) gratuitously new. <i>Newfangled ideas.</i>
popular	(of cultural activities or products) intended for or suited to the taste, understanding, or means of the general public rather than specialists or intellectuals. <i>Many adult cats contrary to popular opinion dislike milk.</i>
present	Something presented as a gift. <i>We presented the arguments to him.</i>
presently	In the near future. <i>This will be examined in more detail presently.</i>
recency	A time immediately before the present.
recent	Approximately the last 10,000 years. <i>Recent buds on the apple trees.</i>
recently	In the recent past. <i>Until recently we had a female doctor.</i>
resurgent	Increasing or reviving after a period of little activity, popularity, or occurrence. <i>Resurgent nationalism.</i>

- stylish** Having elegance or taste or refinement in manners or dress.
*You don't have to be a designer to create a **stylish** look in your own small room.*
- unconventional** Not conforming to accepted rules or standards.
*An **unconventional** marriage.*
- up-to-date** A participant in a date.
- urbanity** Urban life.
*A picture of banal **urbanity**.*
- vogue** General acceptance or favour; popularity.
*The **vogue** is to make realistic films.*
- whereabouts** Where or approximately where.
***Whereabouts** do you come from.*
