**in fashion**

Currently fashionable.

**in vogue**

Currently fashionable.

**modern**

Belonging to the modern era since the Middle Ages.  
*Matisse's contribution to **modern** art.*

**modish**

In the current fashion or style.  
*It seems sad that such a scholar should feel compelled to use this **modish** jargon.*

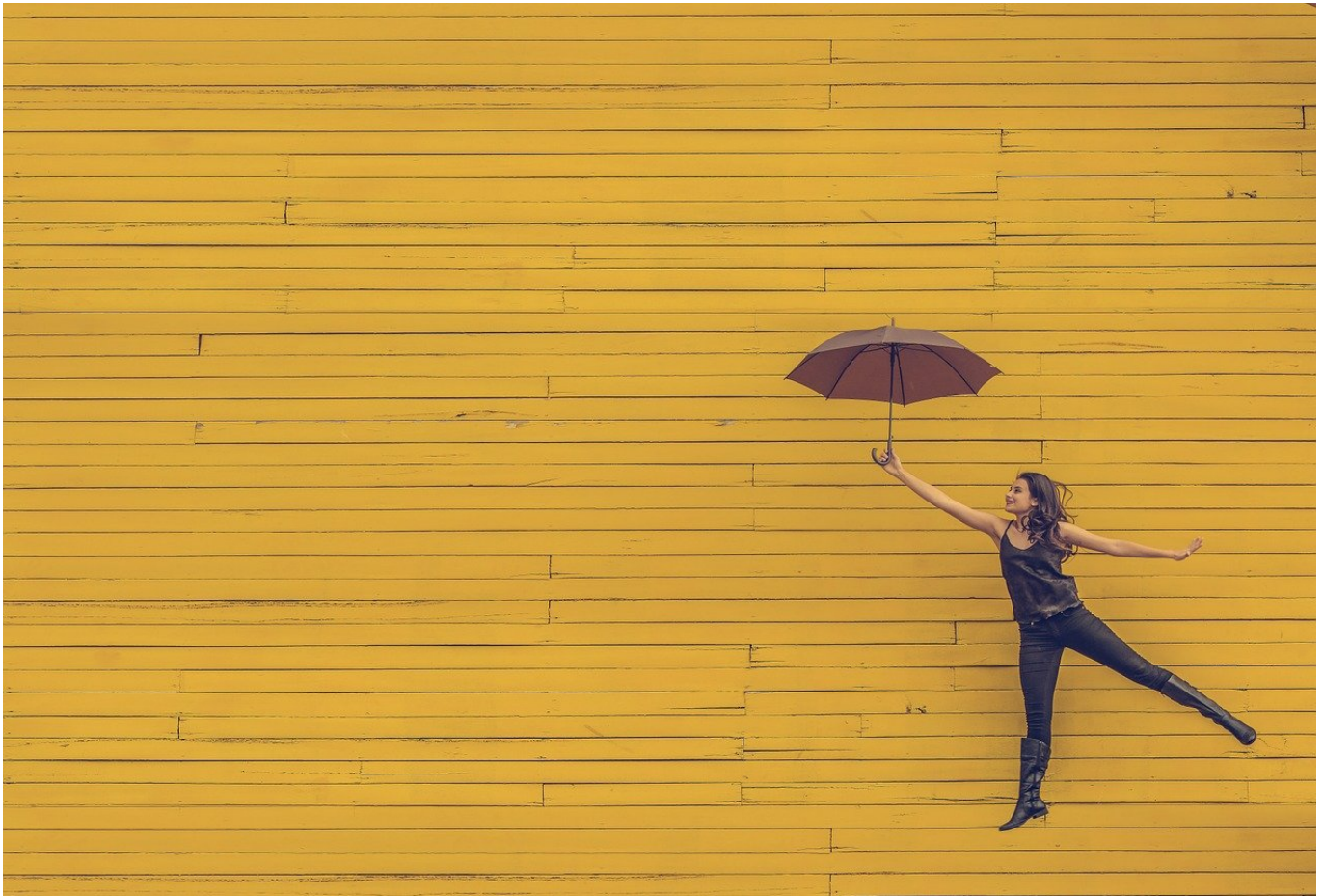
**popular**

(of music or art) new and of general appeal (especially among young people).  
*The **popular** vote.*

**stylish**

Being or in accordance with current social fashions.  
*The **stylish** resort of Gstaad.*

<b>trendsetting</b>	Initiating or popularizing a trend.
<b>up to date</b>	Extending or moving toward a higher place.
<b>up to the minute</b>	Getting higher or more vigorous.
<b>voguish</b>	Popular or in fashion at a particular time. <i>Mermaid chic is very <b>voguish</b> this season.</i>

<b>abreast</b>	Side by side and facing the same way. <i>Keeping <b>abreast</b> of developments.</i>
<b>alongside</b>	Side by side.
<b>chic</b>	Elegance by virtue of being fashionable. <i>The hotel s lobby and restaurant are the height of designer <b>chic</b>.</i>
<b>craze</b>	State of violent mental agitation. <i><b>Crazed</b> by hunger the population began to turn on the rebels.</i>
<b>current</b>	A flow of electricity through a conductor. <i>The <b>current</b> topic.</i>
<b>dapper</b>	Neat and trim in dress and appearance (typically used of a man). <i>A <b>dapper</b> young man.</i>
<b>fad</b>	An arbitrary like or dislike. <i>His <b>fads</b> about the type of coffee he must have.</i>

<b>faddish</b>	Intensely fashionable or popular for a short period of time. <i>Tastes in flavoured coffee are so <b>faddish</b>.</i>
<b>fashion</b>	Use materials to produce (something). <i>The latest Parisian <b>fashions</b>.</i>
<b>inimitable</b>	So good or unusual as to be impossible to copy; unique. <i>An <b>inimitable</b> style.</i>
<b>jaunty</b>	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. <i>A <b>jaunty</b> red hat.</i>
<b>lately</b>	Recently; not long ago. <i><b>Lately</b> the rules have been enforced.</i>
<b>latest</b>	Up to the immediate present; most recent or most up-to-date. <i>The <b>latest</b> news.</i>
<b>modern</b>	Belonging to the modern era since the Middle Ages. <i>They do not have <b>modern</b> weapons.</i>
<b>modish</b>	Conforming to or following what is currently popular and fashionable. <i>It seems sad that such a scholar should feel compelled to use this <b>modish</b> jargon.</i>
<b>natty</b>	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. <i>A <b>natty</b> blue blazer.</i>
<b>newfangled</b>	(of a new kind or fashion) gratuitously new. <i><b>Newfangled</b> ideas.</i>
<b>popular</b>	(of cultural activities or products) intended for or suited to the taste, understanding, or means of the general public rather than specialists or intellectuals. <i>Many adult cats contrary to <b>popular</b> opinion dislike milk.</i>
<b>present</b>	Something presented as a gift. <i>We <b>presented</b> the arguments to him.</i>
<b>presently</b>	In the near future. <i>This will be examined in more detail <b>presently</b>.</i>
<b>recency</b>	A time immediately before the present.
<b>recent</b>	Approximately the last 10,000 years. <i><b>Recent</b> buds on the apple trees.</i>
<b>recently</b>	In the recent past. <i>Until <b>recently</b> we had a female doctor.</i>
<b>resurgent</b>	Increasing or reviving after a period of little activity, popularity, or occurrence. <i><b>Resurgent</b> nationalism.</i>

- stylish** Having elegance or taste or refinement in manners or dress.  
*You don't have to be a designer to create a **stylish** look in your own small room.*
- unconventional** Not conforming to accepted rules or standards.  
*An **unconventional** marriage.*
- up-to-date** A participant in a date.
- urbanity** Urban life.  
*A picture of banal **urbanity**.*
- vogue** General acceptance or favour; popularity.  
*The **vogue** is to make realistic films.*
- whereabouts** Where or approximately where.  
***Whereabouts** do you come from.*
