abrupt	Exceedingly sudden and unexpected. <i>An abrupt reply.</i>
agility	Ability to move quickly and easily. <i>Games teach hand eye coordination mental agility and alertness.</i>
airspeed	The speed of an aircraft relative to the air through which it is moving.
celerity	Swiftness of movement.
dash	A punctuation mark (-) used between parts of a compound word or between the syllables of a word when the word is divided at the end of a line of text. <i>I must dash I m late.</i>
expeditiously	With speed and efficiency. <i>The directors will move expeditiously to reach a conclusion.</i>
fastness	A secure place well protected by natural features. <i>A remote Himalayan mountain fastness.</i>
haste	Overly eager speed (and possible carelessness). <i>I write in haste.</i>
hasten	Act or move at high speed. <i>This tragedy probably hastened his own death from heart disease.</i>
hastily	In a hurried or hasty manner. <i>Maybe I acted too hastily.</i>
hie	Go quickly. <i>I hied down to New Orleans.</i>
hurried	Done in a hurry; rushed. <i>I ate a hurried breakfast.</i>
hurriedly	In a quick or rushed manner. <i>The way they buried him so hurriedly was disgraceful.</i>
hurry	A condition of urgency making it necessary to hurry. <i>Hurry up and finish your meal.</i>

overhasty	Done with very great haste and without due deliberation. <i>Rejected what was regarded as an overhasty plan for reconversion.</i>
precipitant	Done with very great haste and without due deliberation. <i>Depression may be a precipitant in many cases.</i>
quick	Moving quickly and lightly. <i>The quick and the dead.</i>
quicken	Make keen or more acute. <i>She quickened her pace desperate to escape.</i>
quickly	With speed. <i>We moved quickly to deal with our auditor s questions.</i>
<u>quickness</u>	A rate that is rapid. <i>An athlete with outstanding quickness and agility.</i>
rapidity	A rate that is rapid. <i>Technology spreads with extraordinary rapidity.</i>
rapidly	Very quickly; at a great rate. <i>The business is expanding rapidly.</i>
rush	Cause to move fast or to rush or race. <i>How much did they rush you for this heap.</i>
rushed	Done or completed too hurriedly; hasty. <i>A rushed job.</i>
<u>speed</u>	Of a motorist travel at a speed that is greater than the legal limit. <i>The car that crashed was speeding.</i>
<u>speedy</u>	Done or occurring quickly. <i>A speedy winger.</i>
<u>swift</u>	A swift flying insectivorous bird with long slender wings and a superficial resemblance to a swallow spending most of its life on the wing. <i>The swiftest horse in his stable.</i>
swiftness	Lack of delay; promptness. <i>The dynasty crumbled with alarming swiftness.</i>
urgently	In an earnest and persistent manner. <i>Housing is urgently needed.</i>
velocity	The rate at which money changes hands within an economy. <i>The tank shot backwards at an incredible velocity.</i>
