## Associations of "Fast paced" (30 Words)

<b><u>abrupt</u></b>	Exceedingly sudden and unexpected. <i>An <b>abrupt</b> reply.</i>
<b><u>agility</u></b>	Ability to move quickly and easily. <i>Games teach hand eye coordination mental <b>agility</b> and alertness.</i>
<b>airspeed</b>	The speed of an aircraft relative to the air through which it is moving.
<b>celerity</b>	Swiftness of movement.
<b>dash</b>	A punctuation mark (-) used between parts of a compound word or between the syllables of a word when the word is divided at the end of a line of text. <i>I must <b>dash</b> I m late.</i>
<b><u>expeditiously</u></b>	With speed and efficiency. <i>The directors will move <b>expeditiously</b> to reach a conclusion.</i>
<b>fastness</b>	A secure place well protected by natural features. <i>A remote Himalayan mountain <b>fastness</b>.</i>
<b><u>haste</u></b>	Overly eager speed (and possible carelessness). <i>I write in <b>haste</b>.</i>
<b>hasten</b>	Act or move at high speed. <i>This tragedy probably <b>hastened</b> his own death from heart disease.</i>
<b>hastily</b>	In a hurried or hasty manner. <i>Maybe I acted too <b>hastily</b>.</i>
<b>hie</b>	Go quickly. <i>I <b>hied</b> down to New Orleans.</i>
<b>hurried</b>	Done in a hurry; rushed. <i>I ate a <b>hurried</b> breakfast.</i>
<b>hurriedly</b>	In a quick or rushed manner. <i>The way they buried him so <b>hurriedly</b> was disgraceful.</i>
<b>hurry</b>	A condition of urgency making it necessary to hurry. <i><b>Hurry</b> up and finish your meal.</i>

<b>overhasty</b>	Done with very great haste and without due deliberation. <i>Rejected what was regarded as an <b>overhasty</b> plan for reconversion.</i>
<b>precipitant</b>	Done with very great haste and without due deliberation. <i>Depression may be a <b>precipitant</b> in many cases.</i>
<b>quick</b>	Moving quickly and lightly. <i>The <b>quick</b> and the dead.</i>
<b>quicken</b>	Make keen or more acute. <i>She <b>quicken</b>ed her pace desperate to escape.</i>
<b>quickly</b>	With speed. <i>We moved <b>quickly</b> to deal with our auditor s questions.</i>
<b><u>quickness</u></b>	A rate that is rapid. <i>An athlete with outstanding <b>quickness</b> and agility.</i>
<b>rapidity</b>	A rate that is rapid. <i>Technology spreads with extraordinary <b>rapidity</b>.</i>
<b>rapidly</b>	Very quickly; at a great rate. <i>The business is expanding <b>rapidly</b>.</i>
<b>rush</b>	Cause to move fast or to rush or race. <i>How much did they <b>rush</b> you for this heap.</i>
<b>rushed</b>	Done or completed too hurriedly; hasty. <i>A <b>rushed</b> job.</i>
<b><u>speed</u></b>	Of a motorist travel at a speed that is greater than the legal limit. <i>The car that crashed was <b>speeding</b>.</i>
<b><u>speedy</u></b>	Done or occurring quickly. <i>A <b>speedy</b> winger.</i>
<b><u>swift</u></b>	A swift flying insectivorous bird with long slender wings and a superficial resemblance to a swallow spending most of its life on the wing. <i>The <b>swiftest</b> horse in his stable.</i>
<b>swiftness</b>	Lack of delay; promptness. <i>The dynasty crumbled with alarming <b>swiftness</b>.</i>
<b>urgently</b>	In an earnest and persistent manner. <i>Housing is <b>urgently</b> needed.</i>
<b>velocity</b>	The rate at which money changes hands within an economy. <i>The tank shot backwards at an incredible <b>velocity</b>.</i>
