## **Favor as a Noun**

### **Definitions of "Favor" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “favor” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *An inclination to approve.*
- *A feeling of favorable regard.*
- *Souvenir consisting of a small gift given to a guest at a party.*
- *An act of gracious kindness.*
- *An advantage to the benefit of someone or something.*

- favour** A feeling of favorable regard.  
*Training is looked upon with **favour** by many employers.*
- party favor** An organization to gain political power.
- party favour** An occasion on which people can assemble for social interaction and entertainment.

## Favor as a Verb

### Definitions of "Favor" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "favor" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Bestow a privilege upon.*
- *Treat gently or carefully.*
- *Consider as the favorite.*
- *Promote over another.*



### Synonyms of "Favor" as a verb (3 Words)

**favour**      Work to the advantage of.  
*Critics argued that the policy **favoured** the private sector.*



**prefer**

Give preference to one creditor over another.

We **prefer** sleeping outside.

**privilege**

Bestow a privilege upon.

Barristers are **privileged** from arrest going to coming from and abiding in court.





## Usage Examples of "Favor" as a verb

- *The local team was favored.*
- *He favors his second daughter.*



## Associations of "Favor" (30 Words)

<b>affable</b>	Friendly, good-natured, or easy to talk to. An <b>affable</b> smile.
<b>amiable</b>	Disposed to please- Hal Hinson. The <b>amiable</b> young man greeted me enthusiastically.
<b>amity</b>	A state of friendship and cordiality. The presence of French troops in Scotland had produced hostility rather than <b>amity</b> .
<b>approval</b>	The formal act of approving. Step parents need to win a child's <b>approval</b> .

<b>benefic</b>	Beneficent or kindly. A <b>benefic</b> force.
<b>beneficence</b>	The quality of being kind or helpful or generous.
<b>benignity</b>	Kindness or tolerance toward others. His air of <b>benignity</b> .
<b>blessing</b>	A ceremonial prayer invoking divine protection. May God continue to give us his <b>blessing</b> .
<b>compassion</b>	Sympathetic pity and concern for the sufferings or misfortunes of others. The victims should be treated with <b>compassion</b> .
<b>congenial</b>	Suitable to your needs- T.L.Peacock. He went back to a climate more <b>congenial</b> to his cold stony soul.
<b>cordiality</b>	A cordial disposition.
<b>courteous</b>	Characterized by courtesy and gracious good manners-Francis Bacon. A <b>courteous</b> young man.
<b>courtesy</b>	A courteous or respectful or considerate remark. Links to the manufacturers websites are provided as a <b>courtesy</b> to the user.
<b>curtsy</b>	Make a curtsy usually done only by girls and women as a sign of respect. She bobbed a <b>curtsy</b> to him.
<b>favorable</b>	Presaging or likely to bring good luck. A <b>favorable</b> reply.
<b>friendliness</b>	A feeling of liking for another person; enjoyment in their company. I was overwhelmed by the <b>friendliness</b> of the people here.
<b>friendly</b>	Inclined to help or support; not antagonistic or hostile. A <b>friendly</b> neighborhood.
<b>generosity</b>	The trait of being willing to give your money or time. Diners certainly cannot complain about the <b>generosity</b> of portions.
<b>genial</b>	Diffusing warmth and friendliness. A <b>genial</b> host.
<b>goodwill</b>	The established reputation of a business regarded as a quantifiable asset and calculated as part of its value when it is sold. A <b>goodwill</b> gesture.
<b>inclination</b>	(astronomy) the angle between the plane of the orbit and the plane of the ecliptic stated in degrees. Her <b>inclination</b> is for classical music.
<b>kind</b>	Having or showing a tender and considerate and helpful nature; used especially of persons and their behavior. Our neighbor was very <b>kind</b> about the window our son broke.



<b>kindness</b>	The quality of being friendly, generous, and considerate. <i>He thanked them for their <b>kindness</b> and support.</i>
<b>opt</b>	Make a choice from a range of possibilities. <i>Consumers will <b>opt</b> for low priced goods.</i>
<b><u>penchant</u></b>	A strong or habitual liking for something or tendency to do something. <i>The Irish have a <b>penchant</b> for blarney.</i>
<b><u>predilection</u></b>	A predisposition in favor of something. <i>A <b>predilection</b> for expensive cars.</i>
<b><u>prefer</u></b>	Give preference to one creditor over another. <i>Some people <b>prefer</b> camping to staying in hotels.</i>
<b>preference</b>	A thing preferred. <i>My own <b>preference</b> is for good literature.</i>
<b>privilege</b>	Grant a privilege or privileges to. <i>Barristers are <b>privileged</b> from arrest going to coming from and abiding in court.</i>
<b>requisition</b>	Make a formal request for official services. <i>I had to make various <b>requisitions</b> for staff and accommodation.</i>
