Synonyms of "Favorable" as an adjective (5 Words)

favourable (of weather, or a period of time judged in terms of its weather) fine.

The settlement was **favourable** to the unions.

golden (of an opportunity) very favourable.

Curls of glossy **golden** hair.

Presaging or likely to bring good luck or a good outcome.

A **lucky** man.

prosperousMarked by peace and prosperity.
