## **Favorable as an Adjective**

### **Definitions of "Favorable" as an adjective**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “favorable” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Giving an advantage.*
- *Inclined to help or support; not antagonistic or hostile.*
- *Encouraging or approving or pleasing.*
- *Presaging or likely to bring good luck or a good outcome.*
- *Occurring at a convenient or suitable time.*
- *(of winds or weather) tending to promote or facilitate.*
- *Tending to promote or facilitate.*
- *Presaging or likely to bring good luck.*



## Synonyms of "Favorable" as an adjective (5 Words)

- advantageous** Appropriate for achieving a particular end; implies a lack of concern for fairness.  
*Socially **advantageous** to entertain often.*
- favourable** (of weather, or a period of time judged in terms of its weather) fine.  
*The settlement was **favourable** to the unions.*
- golden** (of an opportunity) very favourable.  
*Curls of glossy **golden** hair.*
- lucky** Presaging or likely to bring good luck or a good outcome.  
*A **lucky** man.*
- prosperous** Marked by peace and prosperity.  
*We wish you a Merry Christmas and a **prosperous** New Year.*



## Usage Examples of "Favorable" as an adjective

- *Made a favorable impression.*
- *Listened with a favorable ear.*
- *A favorable reply.*
- *He received a favorable rating.*
- *The days were fair and the winds were favorable.*
- *A favorable time to ask for a raise.*

<b>amicable</b>	Characterized by friendship and good will. <i>An <b>amicable</b> settlement of the dispute.</i>
<b>amity</b>	Friendly relations. <i>The presence of French troops in Scotland had produced hostility rather than <b>amity</b>.</i>
<b>approving</b>	The formal act of approving. <i>The wine drew <b>approving</b> comments from across the table.</i>
<b>auspicious</b>	Auguring favorable circumstances and good luck. <i>He was respectful to his <b>auspicious</b> customers.</i>
<b>benign</b>	(of a tumour) not malignant. <i>A <b>benign</b> smile.</i>
<b>companionable</b>	Friendly and sociable. <i>A <b>companionable</b> young man.</i>
<b>complaisant</b>	Showing a cheerful willingness to do favors for others. <i>To close one's eyes like a <b>complaisant</b> husband whose wife has taken a lover.</i>
<b>congenial</b>	Suitable to your needs. <i>His need for some <b>congenial</b> company.</i>
<b>cordial</b>	Politely warm and friendly. <i>I earned his <b>cordial</b> loathing.</i>
<b>cordiality</b>	A cordial disposition.
<b>courteous</b>	Characterized by courtesy and gracious good manners-Francis Bacon. <i>A <b>courteous</b> young man.</i>
<b>dearly</b>	With affection. <i>She loved him <b>dearly</b>.</i>
<b>extroverted</b>	Not introspective; examining what is outside yourself. <i>She is <b>extroverted</b> confident and gives rousing lectures.</i>
<b>favor</b>	A feeling of favorable regard. <i>The outcome was in his <b>favor</b>.</i>
<b>friendly</b>	Easy to understand or use. <i>A <b>friendly</b> neighborhood.</i>
<b>genial</b>	Of or relating to the chin or median part of the lower jaw. <i>The <b>genial</b> sunshine.</i>
<b>gregarious</b>	(of animals) living in flocks or loosely organized communities. <i><b>Gregarious</b> species forage in flocks from colonies or roosts.</i>
<b>hearty</b>	Without reservation. <i><b>Hearty</b> support.</i>

<b>kindly</b>	Kind, warm-hearted, or gentle. <i>Never mind she said <b>kindly</b>.</i>
<b>lucky</b>	Having, bringing, or resulting from good luck. <i>You had a very <b>lucky</b> escape.</i>
<b>obliging</b>	Willing to do a service or kindness; helpful. <i>The <b>obliging</b> waiter was in no hurry for us to leave.</i>
<b>optimism</b>	The doctrine, especially as set forth by Leibniz, that this world is the best of all possible worlds. <i>The talks had been amicable and there were grounds for <b>optimism</b>.</i>
<b>pacific</b>	The largest ocean in the world. <i>The result of this <b>pacific</b> policy was that no troops were called up.</i>
<b>peaceable</b>	Inclined or disposed to peace. <i>An industrious <b>peaceable</b> people.</i>
<b>propitious</b>	Presenting favorable circumstances; likely to result in or show signs of success. <i><b>Propitious</b> gales speeded us along.</i>
<b>sociable</b>	An S-shaped couch for two people who sit partially facing each other. <i>A very <b>sociable</b> little village.</i>
<b>unthreatening</b>	Not unfriendly or threatening. <i>A quiet and <b>unthreatening</b> place.</i>
