- bm** Solid excretory product evacuated from the bowels.
- dejection** A sad and depressed state; low spirits.
*He was slumped in deep **dejection**.*
- faecal matter** A vaguely specified concern.
- faeces** Waste matter remaining after food has been digested, discharged from the bowels; excrement.
- fecal matter** Some situation or event that is thought about.
- ordure** Something regarded as vile or abhorrent.
*Can you give credence to this **ordure**.*
- stool** Solid excretory product evacuated from the bowels.
*Fibre in the child s diet will soften the **stools**.*



Associations of "Feces" (30 Words)

- aft** Situated at near or towards the stern of a ship or tail of an aircraft.
*Ships with square sails sail fairly efficiently with the wind **abaft**.*
- bulkhead** A dividing wall or barrier between separate compartments inside a ship, aircraft, or other vehicle.
- compost** Make vegetable matter or manure into compost.
*Cover with a layer of fine **compost**.*
- deck** A set of two or more record decks connected to sound mixing equipment used by a DJ.
*Sitting on his **deck** on that sunny Sunday afternoon.*
- digest** A substance or mixture obtained by digestion.
*I cannot **digest** all this information.*

digestion	The process of decomposing organic matter (as in sewage) by bacteria or by chemical action or heat. <i>He suffered with his digestion.</i>
dung	Drop or spread dung on a piece of ground. <i>You must dung the land.</i>
eliminate	Eliminate from the body. <i>The police have eliminated Lawrence from their inquiries.</i>
evacuation	The bodily process of discharging waste matter. <i>There were waves of evacuation during the blitz.</i>
excrement	Waste matter discharged from the bowels; faeces.
excrete	Eliminate from the body. <i>Excess bicarbonate is excreted by the kidney.</i>
excretion	(in living organisms and cells) the process of eliminating or expelling waste matter. <i>Bodily excretions.</i>
fertilizer	Any substance such as manure or a mixture of nitrates used to make soil more fertile. <i>Sewage sludge could be a valuable fertilizer for use in British forests.</i>
filth	Corrupt behaviour; decadence. <i>You and all the others like you are filth.</i>
forecastle	A raised deck at the front of a ship.
humus	A thick spread made from mashed chickpeas, tahini, lemon juice and garlic; used especially as a dip for pita; originated in the Middle East.
ingestion	The process of absorbing information. <i>The effect of caffeine ingestion on exercise performance.</i>
lavatory	A room or building equipped with one or more toilets. <i>I needed to go to the lavatory.</i>
manure	Spread manure as for fertilization. <i>Artificial manures.</i>
mulch	Treat or cover with mulch. <i>The perennials have been cut back and mulched.</i>
nutrient	Any substance (such as a chemical element or inorganic compound) that can be taken in by a green plant and used in organic synthesis. <i>Fish is a source of many important nutrients including protein vitamins and minerals.</i>
organic	A food produced by organic farming. <i>The organic unity of the integral work of art.</i>

peat	A cut piece of peat. A peat bog.
secretion	A substance discharged by secretion. <i>Hormonal secretions.</i>
sludge	An unattractive muddy shade of brown or green. <i>Miscellaneous chemicals and treated sludges.</i>
sweat	Exude sweat. <i>He was sweating profusely.</i>
toilet	A room or building equipped with one or more toilets. <i>Her toilet completed she finally went back downstairs.</i>
urinary	Of or relating to the urinary system of the body. <i>The urinary tract.</i>
waste	Run off as waste. <i>If the effort brings no compensating gain it is a waste.</i>
