languish Pine with love or grief.

He has been **languish**ing in jail since 1974.

powerless Without ability, influence, or power.

Troops were **powerless** to stop last night s shooting.

(used especially of persons) of inferior size.

puny Puny excuses.

A thing which one is required to do as part of a job, role, or legal obligation.

responsibility A true leader takes **responsibility** for their team and helps them achieve

goals.

(of a person) having or showing the weaknesses or diseases of old age,

senile especially a loss of mental faculties.

Senile decay.

Lessen the effectiveness, power, or ability of, especially gradually or
