| ascend | Go back in order of genealogical succession. <i>Some executives ascend to top level positions.</i> |
| ascending | The act of changing location in an upward direction. <i>Incomes ranked in ascending order of size.</i> |
| ascent | A movement upward. <i>The first balloon ascent was in 1783.</i> |
| boost | Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>The singer had to be boosted onto the stage by a special contraption.</i> |
| <u>climb</u> | A mountain hill or slope that is climbed. <i>The book climbed to number 18 on the New York Times bestseller list.</i> |
| <u>climbing</u> | The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i>His other great interest was climbing especially in the Alps.</i> |
| <u>elevate</u> | Raise in rank or condition. <i>He has elevated bad taste into an art form.</i> |
| elevator | A hinged flap on the tailplane of an aircraft, typically one of a pair, used to control the motion of the aircraft about its lateral axis. <i>First you trim the rudder then the ailerons and finally the elevator.</i> |
| escalator | A stairway whose steps move continuously on a circulating belt. |
| high | Literal meaning being at or having a relatively great or specific elevation or upward extension sometimes used in combinations like knee high. <i>The sculpture stood about five feet high.</i> |
| <u>hoist</u> | Raise or haul up. <i>Hoist a sail.</i> |
| ladder | With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>The first time I put them on one of the stockings laddered.</i> |
| lift | An act of lifting. <i>The best way to lift nations out of poverty is through trade.</i> |

| mounting | The action of mounting something. <i>The mounting of rapid fire guns.</i> |
| precipitate | A precipitated solid substance in suspension or after settling or filtering. <i>They were precipitated into a conflict for which they were quite unprepared.</i> |
| promote | Of an additive act as a promoter of a catalyst. <i>They are using famous personalities to promote the library nationally.</i> |
| raise | Multiply a number by itself a specified number of times 8 is 2 raised to the power 3. <i>We raise hogs here.</i> |
| rise | Rise to one s feet. <i>Non supervisory staff were given a 5 per cent rise.</i> |
| risen | Above the horizon. <i>The risen sun.</i> |
| rising | Newly come into prominence. <i>The Warsaw rising of 1944.</i> |
| soar | Fly upwards or high in the sky. <i>The stock market soared after the cease fire was announced.</i> |
| soaring | Increasing rapidly above the usual level. <i>The coloured trails of soaring rockets.</i> |
| stairs | A flight of stairs or a flight of steps. |
| stepladder | A folding portable ladder hinged at the top. |
| underpin | Support (a building or other structure) from below by laying a solid foundation below ground level or by substituting stronger for weaker materials. <i>The theme of honour underpinning the two books.</i> |
| uphill | Requiring great effort; difficult. <i>The journey is slightly uphill.</i> |
| upstairs | With respect to the mind. <i>An upstairs bedroom.</i> |
| upward | Directed up. <i>An upward trend in sales.</i> |
| vertically | In a vertical direction. <i>Vertically integrated companies.</i> |
| zoom | Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out. <i>During filming it is possible to zoom.</i> |
