- The act of constituting a political unity out of a number of separate states or colonies or provinces so that each member retains the management of its internal affairs.
- A union of political organizations.
- An organization or group within which smaller divisions have some degree of internal autonomy.
- A group of states with a central government but independence in internal affairs.
- An organization formed by merging several groups or parties.

grouping	The activity of putting things together in groups. The <b>grouping</b> of pupils by overall aptitude.
<u>league</u>	The contest for the championship of a league. <i>The year we won the <b>league</b></i> .
partnership	The state of being a partner or partners. The <b>partnership</b> now owns 22 department stores.
<u>union</u>	A trade union. Their <b>union</b> had not been blessed with children

# Associations of "Federation" (30 Words)

affiliation	A social or business relationship. The group has no <b>affiliation</b> to any preservation society.
alliance	A formal agreement establishing an association or alliance between nations or other groups to achieve a particular aim. <i>An <b>alliance</b> between medicine and morality.</i>
<u>ally</u>	Become an ally or associate as by a treaty or marriage. <i>He s a good <b>ally</b> in fight.</i>
amalgamate	To bring or combine together or with something else. <i>He</i> <b>amalgamate</b> d his company with another.
<u>annex</u>	Add or attach as a condition or consequence. The left bank of the Rhine was <b>annex</b> ed by France in 1797.



association	The state of occurring with something else; co-occurrence. A bog <b>association</b> containing ericaceous plants.
coalescing	Growing together, fusing.
<u>coalition</u>	An organization of people (or countries) involved in a pact or treaty. A <b>coalition</b> between Liberals and Conservatives.
collaboration	Something produced in collaboration with someone. His recent opera was a <b>collaboration</b> with Lessing.
<u>collective</u>	A collective farm. <i>The collective mind</i> .
combine	Combine so as to form a whole mix. <b>Combine</b> the flour with the margarine and salt.
community	The condition of sharing or having certain attitudes and interests in common. Community health services.
confederacy	A secret agreement between two or more people to perform an unlawful act. The Italian <b>confederacy</b> known as the Lombard League.
<u>confederation</u>	The act of forming an alliance or confederation. A <b>confederation</b> of trade unions.
<u>consolidate</u>	Combine (a number of things) into a single more effective or coherent whole. <i>Consolidate</i> one s gains.
cooperation	Joint operation or action. They agreed on a policy of <b>cooperation</b> .
coordinated	Operating as a unit. A <b>coordinated</b> program.
<u>ethnicity</u>	An ethnic quality or affiliation resulting from racial or cultural ties. <b>Ethnicity</b> has a strong influence on community status relations.
federate	Relating to a federated state or organization. The country was <b>federate</b> d after the civil war.
<u>fusion</u>	The combining of images from the two eyes to form a single visual percept. <i>A fusion reactor</i> .
integrate	Become one become integrated. <i>Cities efforts to <b>integrate</b></i> .
integrated	Formed into a whole or introduced into another entity- Dwight D.Eisenhower. An <b>integrated</b> Europe.



join	Cause to become joined or linked. I <b>join</b> ed the demonstration.
<u>league</u>	Join in a league or alliance. <i>The <b>league</b> championship.</i>
<u>national</u>	Owned or maintained for the public by the national government. <i>A German <b>national</b></i> .
synthesis	(in Hegelian philosophy) the final stage in the process of dialectical reasoning, in which a new idea resolves the conflict between thesis and antithesis. <i>The synthesis of intellect and emotion in his work.</i>
together	In each other's company. <i>He won the confidence of the government and the rebels but could not</i> <i>bring the two sides <b>together</b>.</i>
<u>union</u>	Of trade unions. A currency <b>union</b> between the two countries.
unite	Be or become joined or united or linked. The two Germanys officially <b>unite</b> d.
<u>united</u>	Used in names of soccer and other sports teams formed by amalgamation. <i>Presented a <b>united</b> front.</i>
