- *The act of constituting a political unity out of a number of separate states or colonies or provinces so that each member retains the management of its internal affairs.*
- *A union of political organizations.*
- *An organization or group within which smaller divisions have some degree of internal autonomy.*
- *A group of states with a central government but independence in internal affairs.*
- *An organization formed by merging several groups or parties.*

federacy	The state of being joined by a treaty.
group	A number of musicians who play popular music together. <i>The bulbs should be planted in groups.</i>
grouping	The activity of putting things together in groups. <i>The grouping of pupils by overall aptitude.</i>
<u>league</u>	The contest for the championship of a league. <i>The year we won the league.</i>
partnership	The state of being a partner or partners. <i>The partnership now owns 22 department stores.</i>
<u>union</u>	A trade union. <i>Their union had not been blessed with children.</i>

Associations of "Federation" (30 Words)

affiliation	A social or business relationship. <i>The group has no affiliation to any preservation society.</i>
alliance	A formal agreement establishing an association or alliance between nations or other groups to achieve a particular aim. <i>An alliance between medicine and morality.</i>
ally	Become an ally or associate as by a treaty or marriage. <i>He s a good ally in fight.</i>
amalgamate	To bring or combine together or with something else. <i>He amalgamated his company with another.</i>
annex	Add or attach as a condition or consequence. <i>The left bank of the Rhine was annexed by France in 1797.</i>

association	The state of occurring with something else; co-occurrence. <i>A bog association containing ericaceous plants.</i>
coalescing	Growing together, fusing.
<u>coalition</u>	An organization of people (or countries) involved in a pact or treaty. <i>A coalition between Liberals and Conservatives.</i>
collaboration	Something produced in collaboration with someone. <i>His recent opera was a collaboration with Lessing.</i>
<u>collective</u>	A collective farm. <i>The collective mind.</i>
combine	Combine so as to form a whole mix. <i>Combine the flour with the margarine and salt.</i>
community	The condition of sharing or having certain attitudes and interests in common. <i>Community health services.</i>
confederacy	A secret agreement between two or more people to perform an unlawful act. <i>The Italian confederacy known as the Lombard League.</i>
<u>confederation</u>	The act of forming an alliance or confederation. <i>A confederation of trade unions.</i>
<u>consolidate</u>	Combine (a number of things) into a single more effective or coherent whole. <i>Consolidate one's gains.</i>
cooperation	Joint operation or action. <i>They agreed on a policy of cooperation.</i>
coordinated	Operating as a unit. <i>A coordinated program.</i>
<u>ethnicity</u>	An ethnic quality or affiliation resulting from racial or cultural ties. <i>Ethnicity has a strong influence on community status relations.</i>
federate	Relating to a federated state or organization. <i>The country was federated after the civil war.</i>
<u>fusion</u>	The combining of images from the two eyes to form a single visual percept. <i>A fusion reactor.</i>
integrate	Become one become integrated. <i>Cities efforts to integrate.</i>
integrated	Formed into a whole or introduced into another entity- Dwight D.Eisenhower. <i>An integrated Europe.</i>

join	Cause to become joined or linked. <i>I joined the demonstration.</i>
league	Join in a league or alliance. <i>The league championship.</i>
national	Owned or maintained for the public by the national government. <i>A German national.</i>
synthesis	(in Hegelian philosophy) the final stage in the process of dialectical reasoning, in which a new idea resolves the conflict between thesis and antithesis. <i>The synthesis of intellect and emotion in his work.</i>
together	In each other's company. <i>He won the confidence of the government and the rebels but could not bring the two sides together.</i>
union	Of trade unions. <i>A currency union between the two countries.</i>
unite	Be or become joined or united or linked. <i>The two Germanys officially united.</i>
united	Used in names of soccer and other sports teams formed by amalgamation. <i>Presented a united front.</i>
