bold	Erotic, risqué, or sexually provocative. <i>Bold settlers on some foreign shore.</i>
<u>driving</u>	Having the power of driving or impelling. <i>A driving personal ambition.</i>
effective	Able to accomplish a purpose functioning effectively. <i>An effective reprimand.</i>
effectual	Producing or capable of producing an intended result or having a striking effect. <i>His complaint proved to be effectual in bringing action.</i>
<u>energetic</u>	Showing or involving great activity or vitality. <i>Moderately energetic exercise.</i>
<u>enterprising</u>	Marked by imagination, initiative, and readiness to undertake new projects. <i>An enterprising foreign policy.</i>
forceful	Forceful and definite in expression or action. <i>A forceful plan for peace.</i>
high-powered	Vigorously energetic or forceful.
huffy	Annoyed or irritated and quick to take offence at petty things. <i>Stayed huffy a good while.</i>
lively	Intellectually stimulating or perceptive. <i>A lively homeward passage dodging aircraft and E boats.</i>
plucky	Showing courage. <i>The plucky youngster has astounded medical staff.</i>
positive	Having a positive charge. <i>There needs to be a positive approach to young offenders.</i>
potent	Having a strong physiological or chemical effect. <i>Thrones were potent symbols of authority.</i>
powerful	Of a person possessing physical strength and weight rugged and powerful. <i>The most powerful government in western Europe.</i>
<u>spirited</u>	Made lively or spirited. <i>A spirited dance.</i>

spunky	Willing to face danger. A spunky performance.
strong	Having a strong physiological or chemical effect. Strong medicine.
thin-skinned	Quick to take offense.
touchy	Easily upset or offended; oversensitive. A touchy subject.
vigorous	Characterized by or involving physical strength, effort, or energy. A vigorous foreign policy.
vital	Manifesting or characteristic of life. Vital for a healthy society.
zestful	Characterized by great enthusiasm and energy. A zestful and exuberant player.

<u>ebullient</u>	(of liquid or matter) boiling or agitated as if boiling. <i>Misted and ebullient seas.</i>
<u>embolden</u>	Cause (a piece of text) to appear in a bold typeface. <i>Centre embolden and underline the heading.</i>
<u>energetic</u>	Possessing or exerting or displaying energy. <i>It caused an energetic chemical reaction.</i>
flamboyant	Marked by ostentation but often tasteless. <i>A flamboyant bow tie.</i>
<u>gall</u>	A digestive juice secreted by the liver and stored in the gallbladder aids in the digestion of fats. <i>Accept life s gall without blaming somebody else.</i>
gutsy	Having or showing courage, determination, and spirit. <i>Her gutsy 80 year old grandmother.</i>
hardy	(of a plant) able to survive outside during winter. <i>Camels are tough and hardy creatures.</i>
<u>impertinent</u>	Not pertinent to the matter under consideration. <i>Impertinent of a child to lecture a grownup.</i>
<u>intrepid</u>	Fearless; adventurous (often used for rhetorical or humorous effect). <i>Intrepid pioneers.</i>
lively	Filled with events or activity. <i>Lively and attractive parents.</i>
pert	Characterized by a lightly pert and exuberant quality. <i>She had a pert nose and deep blue eyes.</i>
plucky	Showing courage. <i>The plucky youngster has astounded medical staff.</i>
raffish	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. <i>A cocktail party given by some raffish bachelors.</i>
robust	(of a system, organization, etc.) able to withstand or overcome adverse conditions. <i>The Caplan family are a robust lot.</i>
<u>spirited</u>	Made lively or spirited. <i>A warm hearted generous spirited man.</i>
sprightly	Full of spirit and vitality. <i>A sprightly dance.</i>
<u>stalwart</u>	Having rugged physical strength; inured to fatigue or hardships. <i>Proud of her tall stalwart son.</i>

unflinching Not shrinking from danger.
*He has shown **unflinching** determination throughout the campaign.*

vibrant Quivering; pulsating.
*The men s **vibrant** voices.*

vigorous Strong and active physically or mentally- W.H.Hudson.
*A **vigorous** campaign.*

vivacious Vigorous and animated.
*She was dark haired and **vivacious**.*
