| plucky | Showing courage. <i>The plucky youngster has astounded medical staff.</i> |
| positive | Having a positive charge. <i>There needs to be a positive approach to young offenders.</i> |
| potent | Having a strong physiological or chemical effect. <i>Thrones were potent symbols of authority.</i> |
| powerful | Of a person possessing physical strength and weight rugged and powerful. <i>The most powerful government in western Europe.</i> |
| <u>spirited</u> | Made lively or spirited. <i>A spirited dance.</i> |

| raffish | Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. <i>A cocktail party given by some raffish bachelors.</i> |
