| discriminate | Distinguish. <i>I could not discriminate the different tastes in this complicated dish.</i> |
| discrimination | Unfair treatment of a person or group on the basis of prejudice. <i>Young children have difficulties in making fine discriminations.</i> |
| discriminatory | Capable of making fine distinctions. <i>A discriminatory tax.</i> |
| equality | The state of being equal, especially in status, rights, or opportunities. <i>An organization aiming to promote racial equality.</i> |
| female | Relating to women or the female gender. <i>The female lead in the play.</i> |
| feminism | The advocacy of women's rights on the ground of the equality of the sexes. |
| gender | The property in nouns and related words of belonging to a grammatical gender. <i>Everyone always asks which gender I identify as.</i> |
| girl | A girl or young woman with whom a man is romantically involved. <i>A chorus girl.</i> |
| ideology | An orientation that characterizes the thinking of a group or nation. <i>A critique of bourgeois ideology.</i> |

| <u>intolerant</u> | Not tolerant of views, beliefs, or behaviour that differ from one's own. <i>As a society we are more intolerant of certain types of violence than we were in the past.</i> |
| jaundiced | Affected by jaundice, in particular unnaturally yellow in complexion. <i>Takes a jaundiced view of societies and clubs.</i> |
| matriarchy | A form of social organization in which descent and relationship are reckoned through the female line. <i>A matriarchy run by morally superior women.</i> |
| misogynist | Relating to or characteristic of a misogynist. <i>A misogynist attitude.</i> |
| ostracism | (in ancient Greece) temporary banishment from a city by popular vote. <i>The family suffered social ostracism.</i> |
| <u>pacifist</u> | Holding the belief that war and violence are unjustifiable. <i>She was a committed pacifist all her life.</i> |
| prejudiced | Being biased or having a belief or attitude formed beforehand. <i>A prejudiced judge.</i> |
| racist | A person who is prejudiced against or antagonistic towards people on the basis of their membership of a particular racial or ethnic group, typically one that is a minority or marginalized. <i>Racist remarks.</i> |
| <u>radical</u> | A radical sign. <i>Radical political views.</i> |
| reformer | A person who makes changes to something in order to improve it. <i>A skilled reformer of government spending.</i> |
| sexism | Discriminatory or abusive behavior towards members of the opposite sex. <i>Sexism in language is an offensive reminder of the way the culture sees women.</i> |
| <u>sexist</u> | A person with sexist views. <i>Old fashioned sexist attitudes.</i> |
| suffragette | A woman seeking the right to vote through organized protest. |
| suffragist | A person advocating that the right to vote be extended to more people, especially to women. |
