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Associations of "Fermented" (30 Words)

bacteria	Single-celled or noncellular spherical or spiral or rod-shaped organisms lacking chlorophyll that reproduce by fission; important as pathogens and for biochemical properties; taxonomy is difficult; often considered to be.
baked	Intoxicated by drink or drugs, especially cannabis. <i>Land lying baked in the heat.</i>
<u>bread</u>	The bread or wafer used in the Eucharist. <i>Bread the chicken and fry it in oil.</i>
broth	Liquid in which meat and vegetables are simmered; used as a basis for e.g. soups or sauces. <i>The pig made five pots of broth.</i>
cooked	(of food or a meal) prepared by heating. <i>As the result of cooked books stock prices soared.</i>
curry	A pungent dish of vegetables or meats flavored with curry powder and usually eaten with rice. <i>A beef curry.</i>
fermentation	The fermentation process involved in the making of beers wines and spirits in which sugars are converted to ethyl alcohol. <i>The fermentation of organic matter by microorganisms in the gut.</i>
<u>flavor</u>	Lend flavor to.
flour	Cover with flour. <i>Flour fish or meat before frying it.</i>
food	Any solid substance (as opposed to liquid) that is used as a source of nourishment. <i>Food and drink.</i>
leaven	Cause to puff up with a leaven. <i>His sermons benefited from a leavening of humor.</i>

leavening	A quality or element that permeates and modifies or transforms something for the better. <i>During the 18th century yeast was abandoned as a leavening for fruit cakes.</i>
<u>meal</u>	The food eaten during a meal. <i>A bar serving light meals.</i>
noodle	A ribbonlike strip of pasta. <i>Cook the noodles in a large pan of boiling water.</i>
paste	Fasten or stick something with paste. <i>When coating walls with fabric paste the wall not the fabric.</i>
pie	A baked dish of fruit, or meat and vegetables, typically with a top and base of pastry. <i>A meat pie.</i>
<u>rot</u>	Liver rot in sheep. <i>Don t talk rot.</i>
salt	Season or preserve with salt. <i>The region is rich in salt plant communities and reed beds.</i>
<u>sauce</u>	Provide a sauce for something season with a sauce. <i>Tomato sauce.</i>
<u>savory</u>	Any of several aromatic herbs or subshrubs of the genus <i>Satureja</i> having spikes of flowers attractive to bees. <i>A past that was scarcely savory.</i>
soup	Any composition having a consistency suggestive of soup. <i>We re in the soup now.</i>
<u>sour</u>	Go sour or spoil. <i>Water soured with tamarind.</i>
<u>spicy</u>	Flavoured with or fragrant with spice. <i>I like my chili extra spicy.</i>
spoilage	Waste produced by material being spoilt, especially paper that is spoilt in printing.
stew	Food prepared by stewing especially meat or fish with vegetables. <i>Don t get in a stew.</i>
<u>sweet</u>	In an affectionate or loving manner sweet is sometimes a poetic or informal variant of sweetly. <i>Lungfuls of the clean sweet air.</i>
vinegar	Sour-tasting liquid produced usually by oxidation of the alcohol in wine or cider and used as a condiment or food preservative. <i>Her aggrieved tone held a touch of vinegar.</i>

yeast

A commercial leavening agent containing yeast cells used to raise the dough in making bread and for fermenting beer or whiskey.

yogurt

A semi-solid food prepared from milk fermented by added bacteria, often sweetened and flavoured.

*Frozen **yogurts**.*
