badger	Persuade through constant efforts. <i>His daughter was always badgering him to let her join.</i>
<u>barring</u>	The act of excluding someone by a negative vote or veto.
<u>besides</u>	In addition; as well. <i>I'm capable of doing the work and a lot more besides.</i>
by	So as to pass a given point. <i>Put something by for her old age.</i>
defeatist	Demonstrating expectation or acceptance of failure. <i>We have a duty not to be so defeatist.</i>
<u>dwelling</u>	A house, flat, or other place of residence. <i>He built a modest dwelling near the pond.</i>
except	Take exception to. <i>Five classes of advertisement are excepted from control.</i>
exclude	Keep (something) out of a place. <i>The cost for the trip excludes food and beverages.</i>

<u>exhale</u>	Give out (breath or an odor). <i>She sat back and exhaled deeply.</i>
<u>habitat</u>	The natural home or environment of an animal, plant, or other organism. <i>Wild chimps in their natural habitat.</i>
<u>hall</u>	The principal living room of a medieval house. <i>For a brief time they had shared a room in hall.</i>
home	Return home accurately from a long distance. <i>He came from a good home.</i>
<u>household</u>	The establishment and affairs of a royal household. <i>The whole household was asleep.</i>
live	Lead a certain kind of life live in a certain style. <i>Brought to you live from Lincoln Center.</i>
marmot	A heavily built, gregarious burrowing rodent of mountainous country in both Eurasia and North America.
<u>omit</u>	Fail or neglect to do. <i>He modestly omits to mention that he was a pole vault champion.</i>
otter	The fur of an otter.
<u>outside</u>	Functioning outside the boundaries or precincts of an organized unit. <i>An outside door.</i>
pet	A fit of petulance or sulkiness especially at what is felt to be a slight. <i>Another of her pet projects was the arts centre.</i>
<u>rabbit</u>	Flesh of any of various rabbits or hares wild or domesticated eaten as food. <i>Stop rabbiting on will you and go to bed.</i>
respire	Breathe easily again, as after exertion or anxiety. <i>A country where fresh air seems impossible to respire.</i>
shrew	A small insectivorous mammal resembling a mouse, with a long pointed snout and tiny eyes. <i>Hold your nagging tongue you miserable old shrew.</i>
snail	Gather snails. <i>We went snailing in the summer.</i>
wildlife	All living things (except people) that are undomesticated. <i>A wildlife refuge.</i>
