<b>ingenious</b>	(of a person) clever, original, and inventive. <i>An <b>ingenious</b> solution to the problem.</i>
<b>innovational</b>	Being or producing something like nothing done or experienced or created before. <i>A mind so <b>innovational</b> so original.</i>
<b>innovative</b>	Ahead of the times. <i>Writers who are now viewed as <b>innovative</b>.</i>
<b>inventive</b>	Marked by independence and creativity in thought or action- Lewis Mumford. <i>A courageous and <b>inventive</b> piece of film making.</i>
<b>original</b>	Not dependent on other people's ideas; inventive or novel. <i>He kept the <b>original</b> copy and gave her only a xerox.</i>
<b>potent</b>	Capable of copulation. <i>Thrones were <b>potent</b> symbols of authority.</i>
<b>productive</b>	(of a cough) that raises mucus from the respiratory tract. <i><b>Productive</b> farmland.</i>
<b>prolific</b>	Present in large numbers or quantities; plentiful. <i>Mahogany was once <b>prolific</b> in the tropical forests.</i>
<b>propagative</b>	Characterized by propagation or relating to propagation.
<b>reproductive</b>	Producing new life or offspring. <i>The <b>reproductive</b> or generative organs.</i>
<b>resourceful</b>	Having inner resources; adroit or imaginative. <i>The most <b>resourceful</b> cook in town.</i>

<b>dysgenic</b>	Exerting a detrimental effect on later generations through the inheritance of undesirable characteristics. <i><b>Dysgenic</b> breeding.</i>
<b>factory</b>	An establishment for traders carrying on business in a foreign country. <i>He is chaplain to the British <b>factory</b> at St Petersburg.</i>
<b>fecund</b>	Producing many new ideas. <i>Her <b>fecund</b> imagination.</i>
<b>fecundation</b>	Creation by the physical union of male and female gametes; of sperm and ova in an animal or pollen and ovule in a plant.
<b>fecundity</b>	The ability to produce many new ideas. <i>The immense <b>fecundity</b> of his imagination made a profound impact on European literature.</i>
<b>fertility</b>	The quality of being fertile; productiveness. <i>Improve the soil <b>fertility</b> by adding compost.</i>
<b>fructify</b>	Become productive or fruitful. <i>The apple trees <b>fructify</b>.</i>
<b>fruitful</b>	Productive or conducive to producing in abundance. <i>And God said unto them Be <b>fruitful</b> and multiply.</i>
<b>harvest</b>	Gather a crop as a harvest. <i>The quantity of squid <b>harvested</b> has risen.</i>

- profitable** Beneficial; useful.  
***Profitable** speculation on the stock market.*
- prolific** (of a sports player) high-scoring.  
*A **prolific** goalscorer.*
- rich** Marked by richness and fullness of flavor.  
*Many vegetables and fruits are **rich** in vitamins.*
- richness** The quality of containing a large amount of fat, spices, sugar, etc.  
*All are amazed at the **richness** of the colours.*
- topsoil** The top layer of soil.  
*Dry **topsoils** are typical in the western Corn Belt.*
- virility** (in a man) the quality of having strength, energy, and a strong sex drive; manliness.  
*Great importance is placed on a man's **virility**.*
- wealth** Well-being.  
*He used his considerable **wealth** to bribe officials.*
