- *(of a situation) encouraging a particular activity or feeling.*
- *Bearing in abundance especially offspring.*

innovational	Being or producing something like nothing done or experienced or created before. <i>A mind so innovational so original.</i>
innovative	Ahead of the times. <i>Writers who are now viewed as innovative.</i>
<u>inventive</u>	Marked by independence and creativity in thought or action- Lewis Mumford. <i>A courageous and inventive piece of film making.</i>
<u>original</u>	Not dependent on other people's ideas; inventive or novel. <i>He kept the original copy and gave her only a xerox.</i>
potent	Capable of copulation. <i>Thrones were potent symbols of authority.</i>
productive	(of a cough) that raises mucus from the respiratory tract. <i>Productive farmland.</i>
<u>prolific</u>	Present in large numbers or quantities; plentiful. <i>Mahogany was once prolific in the tropical forests.</i>
propagative	Characterized by propagation or relating to propagation.
reproductive	Producing new life or offspring. <i>The reproductive or generative organs.</i>
<u>resourceful</u>	Having inner resources; adroit or imaginative. <i>The most resourceful cook in town.</i>
rich	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>A rich and famous family.</i>

<u>affluent</u>	An affluent person a person who is financially well off. <i>An affluent banker.</i>
arable	Concerned with growing arable crops. <i>Vast areas of arable and pasture.</i>
<u>biodiversity</u>	The variety of plant and animal life in the world or in a particular habitat, a high level of which is usually considered to be important and desirable. <i>A high level of biodiversity is desirable.</i>

birthrate	The ratio of live births in an area to the population of that area; expressed per 1000 population per year.

fecund	Producing many new ideas. <i>Her fecund imagination.</i>
fecundation	Creation by the physical union of male and female gametes; of sperm and ova in an animal or pollen and ovule in a plant.
fecundity	The ability to produce many new ideas. <i>The immense fecundity of his imagination made a profound impact on European literature.</i>
fertility	The quality of being fertile; productiveness. <i>Improve the soil fertility by adding compost.</i>
fructify	Become productive or fruitful. <i>The apple trees fructify.</i>
fruitful	Productive or conducive to producing in abundance. <i>And God said unto them Be fruitful and multiply.</i>
harvest	Gather a crop as a harvest. <i>The quantity of squid harvested has risen.</i>
hinterland	The area around or beyond a major town or port. <i>The strange hinterland where life begins and ends.</i>
land	The land on which real estate is located. <i>The marines landed at a small jetty.</i>
lucrative	Producing a great deal of profit. <i>A lucrative career as a stand up comedian.</i>
make	Make formulate or derive in the mind. <i>Make laws.</i>
produce	Bring onto the market or release. <i>The garden where the artist produced many of his flower paintings.</i>

productive	Producing or capable of producing (especially abundantly). <i>Many suffixes are common and productive.</i>
profitable	Beneficial; useful. <i>Profitable speculation on the stock market.</i>
prolific	(of a sports player) high-scoring. <i>A prolific goalscorer.</i>
rich	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>Many vegetables and fruits are rich in vitamins.</i>
richness	The quality of containing a large amount of fat, spices, sugar, etc. <i>All are amazed at the richness of the colours.</i>
topsoil	The top layer of soil. <i>Dry topsoils are typical in the western Corn Belt.</i>
virility	(in a man) the quality of having strength, energy, and a strong sex drive; manliness. <i>Great importance is placed on a man's virility.</i>
