- (of a person, animal, or plant) able to conceive young or produce seed.
- (of a seed or egg) capable of becoming a new individual.
- Marked by great fruitfulness.
- Intellectually productive.
- Capable of reproducing.
- Producing many new and inventive ideas.
- (of a situation) encouraging a particular activity or feeling.
- Bearing in abundance especially offspring.

<u>fruitful</u>	Productive or conducive to producing in abundance. Memoirs can be a fruitful source of information.
generative	Denoting an approach to any field of linguistics that involves applying a finite set of rules to linguistic input in order to produce all and only the well-formed items of a language. <i>The female reproductive system and its generative cycles.</i>
<u>imaginative</u>	(used of persons or artifacts) marked by independence and creativity in thought or action. An imaginative use of material.
ingenious	(of a person) clever, original, and inventive. An ingenious solution to the problem.
innovational	Being or producing something like nothing done or experienced or created before. <i>A mind so innovational so original.</i>
innovative	Ahead of the times. Writers who are now viewed as innovative .
<u>inventive</u>	Marked by independence and creativity in thought or action- Lewis Mumford. <i>A courageous and inventive piece of film making.</i>
<u>original</u>	Not dependent on other people's ideas; inventive or novel. He kept the original copy and gave her only a xerox.
potent	Capable of copulation. Thrones were potent symbols of authority.
productive	(of a cough) that raises mucus from the respiratory tract. <i>Productive farmland</i> .
<u>prolific</u>	Present in large numbers or quantities; plentiful. Mahogany was once prolific in the tropical forests.
propagative	Characterized by propagation or relating to propagation.
reproductive	Producing new life or offspring. The reproductive or generative organs.
<u>resourceful</u>	Having inner resources; adroit or imaginative. The most resourceful cook in town.
rich	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. A rich and famous family.



visionary

Relating to or having the ability to see visions in a dream or trance, or as a supernatural apparition. *Visionary* schemes for getting rich.

<u>biodiversity</u>	The variety of plant and animal life in the world or in a particular habitat, a high level of which is usually considered to be important and desirable. <i>A high level of biodiversity</i> is desirable.

productive	Producing or capable of producing (especially abundantly. <i>Many suffixes are common and productive</i> .
<u>profitable</u>	Beneficial; useful. Profitable speculation on the stock market.
<u>prolific</u>	(of a sports player) high-scoring. A prolific goalscorer.
rich	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. Many vegetables and fruits are rich in vitamins.
richness	The quality of containing a large amount of fat, spices, sugar, etc. <i>All are amazed at the richness of the colours.</i>
topsoil	The top layer of soil. Dry topsoil s are typical in the western Corn Belt.
<u>virility</u>	(in a man) the quality of having strength, energy, and a strong sex drive; manliness. <i>Great importance is placed on a man s virility.</i>
wealth	Well-being. He used his considerable wealth to bribe officials.
