about	Used of movement to or among many different places or in no particular direction. <i>Dirty clothes lying around or about.</i>
<u>almost</u>	(of actions or states) slightly short of or not quite accomplished; all but. <i>Blues jazz he can play almost anything.</i>
<u>approximate</u>	Close to the actual, but not completely accurate or exact. <i>Sketched in an approximate likeness.</i>
approximately	(of quantities) imprecise but fairly close to correct. <i>Lasted approximately an hour.</i>
approximation	An imprecise or incomplete account. <i>The band smashed up their equipment in an approximation of rock star behaviour.</i>
approximative	Not quite exact or correct. <i>A crudely approximative outline.</i>
around	All around or on all sides. <i>She sleeps around.</i>
<u>broadly</u>	In a wide fashion. <i>He interprets the law broadly.</i>
<u>closely</u>	In an attentive manner. <i>The students had to answer questions closely related to what they just learned.</i>
<u>closeness</u>	The quality of affection or intimacy in a relationship. <i>The closeness of the race.</i>
contiguous	Next or together in sequence. <i>Five hundred contiguous dictionary entries.</i>
equidistant	The same distance apart at every point. <i>The line joins together all points which are equidistant from the two axes.</i>

<u>further</u>	To or at a greater distance in time or space farther is used more frequently than further in this physical sense. <i>Before going any further we need to define our terms.</i>
least	Used in names of very small animals and plants e.g. least shrew. <i>He had a knack for showing up when he was least expected.</i>
little	Small and of little importance. <i>What a big little boy you are.</i>
locality	An area or neighbourhood. <i>The rock's size and locality.</i>
locally	With reference to a particular area or one's neighbourhood. <i>The service control function is installed locally.</i>
more	Moreover. <i>More interesting.</i>
near	Located on the nearside of a vehicle. <i>The conflict is unlikely to be resolved in the near future.</i>
<u>nearby</u>	Not far away in relative terms. <i>Concentrated his study on the nearby planet Venus.</i>
<u>nearly</u>	(of actions or states) slightly short of or not quite accomplished; all but. <i>In the absence of anyone more nearly related I was designated next of kin.</i>
neighboring	Having a common boundary or edge; abutting; touching. <i>Neighboring cities.</i>
perigee	Periapsis in Earth orbit; the point in its orbit where a satellite is nearest to the Earth.
perihelion	Periapsis in solar orbit; the point in the orbit of a planet or comet where it is nearest to the sun. <i>Today Mercury is at perihelion.</i>
proximate	Nearly accurate approximate. <i>The fact that a storm may show up the poor condition of a flat roof does not signify that storm was the proximate cause of damage to it.</i>
<u>proximity</u>	A Gestalt principle of organization holding that (other things being equal) objects or events that are near to one another (in space or time) are perceived as belonging together as a unit. <i>Do not operate microphones in close proximity to television sets.</i>
<u>roughly</u>	With roughness or violence rough is an informal variant for roughly. <i>The narrative is roughly speaking contemporary with the earliest of the gospels.</i>

some	To some extent quite a lot. <i>Some forty people came.</i>
throughout	From first to last. <i>I am grateful for the way in which those who attended the inquiry conducted themselves throughout.</i>
vicinity	A surrounding or nearby region. <i>The abundance and vicinity of country seats.</i>
