- *Violently agitated and turbulent.*
- *Marked by extreme intensity of emotions or convictions; inclined to react violently; fervid.*
- *Violently agitated and turbulent- Ezra Pound.*
- *Showing a heartfelt and powerful intensity.*
- *Having or displaying an intense or ferocious aggressiveness.*
- *Fashionable or attractive in a bold or striking way.*
- *(of a mechanism) having a jolting and powerful abruptness of action.*
- *Ruthless in competition.*

<b>boisterous</b>	Full of rough and exuberant animal spirits. <i>A <b>boisterous</b> crowd.</i>
<b>bowelless</b>	Ruthless in competition. <i><b>Bowelless</b> readiness to take advantage.</i>
<b>cutthroat</b>	Ruthless in competition. <i><b>Cutthroat</b> competition.</i>

<b><u>fervent</u></b>	Extremely hot- Nathaniel Hawthorne- Frances Trollope. <i>A <b>fervent</b> desire to change society.</i>

<b>fervid</b>	Characterized by intense emotion. <i>Set out when the <b>fervid</b> heat subsides.</i>
<b>fiery</b>	Having the bright colour of fire. <i><b>Fiery</b> oratory.</i>
<b>flaming</b>	Of a bright orange or red colour. <i><b>Flaming</b> June.</i>
<b>forceful</b>	Forceful and definite in expression or action. <i>A <b>forceful</b> plan for peace.</i>
<b>furious</b>	Full of anger or energy; violent or intense. <i><b>Furious</b> winds.</i>
<b>immoderate</b>	Beyond reasonable limits. <i><b>Immoderate</b> drinking.</i>
<u><b>impassioned</b></u>	Filled with or showing great emotion. <i>She made an <b>impassioned</b> plea for help.</i>
<u><b>inordinate</b></u>	Beyond normal limits. <i>A book of <b>inordinate</b> length.</i>
<b>intemperate</b>	Having or showing a lack of self-control; immoderate. <i>An <b>intemperate</b> climate.</i>
<b>intense</b>	Extremely sharp or intense. <i>An <b>intense</b> young woman passionate about her art.</i>
<b>passionate</b>	Having or expressing strong emotions. <i>A <b>passionate</b> kiss.</i>
<b>powerful</b>	Possessing physical strength and weight rugged and powerful. <i>A <b>powerful</b> bomb.</i>
<b>rough</b>	Causing or characterized by jolts and irregular movements. <i>A <b>rough</b> guess.</i>
<b>savage</b>	(of an animal or force of nature) fierce, violent, and uncontrolled. <i>Packs of <b>savage</b> dogs roamed the streets.</i>
<b>strong</b>	Having a strong physiological or chemical effect. <i><b>Strong</b> lager.</i>
<b>tearing</b>	Violent; extreme. <i>The <b>tearing</b> wind.</i>
<b>trigger-happy</b>	Irresponsible in the use of firearms.
<u><b>uncontrolled</b></u>	Not controlled. <i>The greatest <b>uncontrolled</b> health problem is AIDS.</i>
<u><b>vehement</b></u>	Showing strong feeling; forceful, passionate, or intense. <i><b>Vehement</b> clapping.</i>

**vicious** (of an animal) wild and dangerous to people.  
**Vicious** kicks.

**violent** Marked by extreme intensity of emotions or convictions inclined to react violently fervid.  
A **violent** clash of colors.

## Associations of "Fierce" (30 Words)

<b>aggressive</b>	Ready or likely to attack or confront; characterized by or resulting from aggression. <i><b>Aggressive</b> drivers.</i>
<b>altercation</b>	Noisy quarrel. <i>I had an <b>altercation</b> with the ticket collector.</i>
<b>barbarism</b>	A word or expression which is badly formed according to traditional philological rules, e.g. a word formed from elements of different languages, such as breathalyser (English and Greek) or television (Greek and Latin). <i>The collapse of civilization and the return to <b>barbarism</b>.</i>
<b>billowing</b>	(of fabric) filled with air and swelling outwards. <i>The restless <b>billowing</b> sea.</i>

<b>brawl</b>	(of a stream) flow noisily. <i>He d got into a drunken <b>brawl</b> in a bar.</i>
<b>brutal</b>	(of persons or their actions) able or disposed to inflict pain or suffering. <i>The <b>brutal</b> honesty of his observations.</i>
<b>cruel</b>	Wilfully causing pain or suffering to others, or feeling no concern about it. <i>Ernie nearly <b>cruelled</b> the whole thing by laughing.</i>
<u><b>cruelty</b></u>	The quality of being cruel and causing tension or annoyance. <i>We can t stand <b>cruelty</b> to animals.</i>
<b>dogfight</b>	Arrange for an illegal dogfight. <i>Their rancor dated from a political <b>dogfight</b> between them.</i>
<b>enraged</b>	Very angry; furious. <i>An <b>enraged</b> mob screamed abuse.</i>
<u><b>ferocious</b></u>	Marked by extreme and violent energy. <i>A <b>ferocious</b> headache.</i>
<u><b>ferocity</b></u>	The property of being wild or turbulent. <i>She hated him with a <b>ferocity</b> that astonished her.</i>
<b>furious</b>	Full of anger or energy; violent or intense. <i><b>Furious</b> winds.</i>
<b>gusty</b>	Having or showing gusto. <i><b>Gusty</b> female vocals.</i>
<b>imprecation</b>	A slanderous accusation. <i>I pushed my way through screaming <b>imprecations</b>.</i>
<b>infuriated</b>	Marked by extreme anger. <i><b>Infuriated</b> onlookers charged the police who were beating the boy.</i>
<b>irate</b>	Feeling or characterized by great anger. <i><b>Irate</b> protesters.</i>
<b>outrage</b>	An action or event causing outrage. <i>Her voice trembled with <b>outrage</b>.</i>
<b>ruthlessness</b>	The quality of lacking pity or compassion for others. <i>The real world <b>ruthlessness</b> of business.</i>
<b>savage</b>	(especially of a dog or wild animal) attack ferociously and maul. <i>A <b>savage</b> attack on the government.</i>
<u><b>savagery</b></u>	The property of being untamed and ferocious. <i>The progress of civilization over <b>savagery</b>.</i>
<b>stormy</b>	(especially of weather) affected or characterized by storms or commotion. <i>A long and <b>stormy</b> debate.</i>

<b>tempestuous</b>	Very stormy. <i>He had a reckless and <b>tempestuous</b> streak.</i>
<b>truculence</b>	Obstreperous and defiant aggressiveness.
<b><u>truculent</u></b>	Defiantly aggressive. <i>A <b>truculent</b> speech against the new government.</i>
<b>tussle</b>	Make messy or untidy. <i>There was a <b>tussle</b> for the ball.</i>
<b><u>vehement</u></b>	Marked by extreme intensity of emotions or convictions; inclined to react violently; fervid. <i><b>Vehement</b> criticism.</i>
<b>vicious</b>	Marked by deep ill will; deliberately harmful. <i><b>Vicious</b> kicks.</i>
<b>violent</b>	Marked by extreme intensity of emotions or convictions inclined to react violently fervid. <i>Felt a <b>violent</b> dislike.</i>
