algebra	A system of algebra based on given axioms. <i>Courses in algebra geometry and Newtonian physics.</i>
architect	A person who is qualified to design buildings and to plan and supervise their construction. <i>The architects of the reform programme.</i>
by	In reserve; not for immediate use. <i>He let only a moment go by.</i>
camp	Establish or set up a camp. <i>The living room was pure camp.</i>
carve	Form by carving. <i>I carved my initials on the tree.</i>
ceramic	Relating to ceramic articles. <i>A ceramic designer.</i>
characterization	A description of the distinctive nature or features of someone or something. <i>The media s characterization of Al Gore as a nerd.</i>
cinematic	Relating to the cinema. <i>Cinematic output.</i>
count	A nobleman in various countries having rank equal to a British earl. <i>Each answer counts as three points.</i>
delineation	Representation by drawing or painting etc. <i>The eventual delineation of the border between the two states.</i>
depiction	The action of depicting something, especially in a work of art. <i>The painting s horrific depiction of war.</i>
gargoyle	An ornament consisting of a grotesquely carved figure of a person or animal.

memorialize	Be or provide a memorial to a person or an event. <i>The President memorialized the heroes of the battle.</i>
<u>monument</u>	An enduring and memorable example of something. <i>A handsome monument of granite is placed over the grave.</i>
nominal	A phrase that can function as the subject or object of a verb. <i>The nominal exchange rate.</i>
oblique	An oblique muscle. <i>Acute and obtuse angles are oblique angles.</i>
painter	An artist who paints pictures. <i>A self employed painter and decorator.</i>
photography	The art or practice of taking and processing photographs.
picture	Represent in a photograph or picture. <i>Poor picture quality.</i>
<u>portrait</u>	A word picture of a person's appearance and character. <i>A portrait painter.</i>
portraiture	A word picture of a person's appearance and character. <i>His strength as a novelist lay in his portraiture of upper class families.</i>
portrayal	A representation by picture or portraiture. <i>His portrayal of the title character.</i>
sculpt	Create by shaping stone or wood or any other hard material. <i>She was teaching him how to sculpt.</i>
sculptor	An artist who makes sculptures.
<u>sculpture</u>	Form or shape as if by sculpture especially with strong smooth curves. <i>The choir stalls were each carefully sculptured.</i>
statuary	A sculptor. <i>Classical statuary.</i>
<u>statue</u>	A carved or cast figure of a person or animal, especially one that is life-size or larger.
statuesque	Of size and dignity suggestive of a statue. <i>Her statuesque beauty.</i>
vandalism	Action involving deliberate destruction of or damage to public or private property. <i>An act of mindless vandalism.</i>
woodwork	The activity or skill of making things from wood. <i>He taught woodwork at night school.</i>
