- *A collection of information about a particular person or thing.*

- A collection of data, programs, etc. stored in a computer's memory or on a storage device under a single identifying name.

single file	A base hit on which the batter stops safely at first base.
text	A textbook. <i>He took as his text the fact that Australia is paradise.</i>

<u>descriptive</u>	Of or relating to an approach to linguistic analysis that aims at the description of a language's forms, structures and usage. <i>The text contains some good descriptive passages.</i>
desktop	The working area of a computer screen regarded as a representation of a notional desktop and containing icons representing items such as files. <i>You can now have multiple overlapping windows on the desktop.</i>
<u>directory</u>	A listing of the files stored in memory (usually on a hard disk).

instructions	A manual usually accompanying a technical device and explaining how to install or operate it.
leaflet	Distribute leaflets to people or an area. <i>Pick up a leaflet from your local branch.</i>
lexicographer	A compiler or writer of a dictionary; a student of the lexical component of language.
listing	A selvedge of a piece of fabric.
