bring to a conclusion	Take something or somebody with oneself somewhere.
clinch	Fasten a rope or angling line with a clinch knot. <i>The nails were clinched.</i>
complete	Complete a pass. <i>He completed his PhD in 1993.</i>
<u>conclude</u>	Bring or come to an end. <i>It s a wicked old world she concluded.</i>
confirm	Administer the religious rite of confirmation to. <i>Two recent experiences have confirmed me in this view.</i>
decide	Cause to decide. <i>The courts decided in favour of the New York claimants.</i>

establish	Build or establish something abstract. <i>Establish a new department.</i>
finalise	Make final; put the last touches on; put into final form.
nail down	Complete a pass.
put the finishing touches to	Put into a certain place or abstract location.
resolve	Reduce a subject, statement, etc. by mental analysis into (separate elements or a more elementary form). <i>Symptoms resolved after a median of four weeks.</i>
seal	Close with or as if with a seal. <i>The pine boarding should be sealed with polyurethane.</i>
secure	Compress (a blood vessel) to prevent bleeding. <i>A loan secured on your home.</i>
set the seal on	Put into a certain place or abstract location.
settle	Give money or property to someone through a deed of settlement or a will. <i>He offered to settle 150 a year on her.</i>
tie up	Perform a marriage ceremony.
work out	Make uniform.
wrap up	Arrange or fold as a cover or protection.

- bargaining** The negotiation of the terms of a transaction or agreement.

<u>conclude</u>	Come to a close. <i>The doctors concluded that Esther had suffered a stroke.</i>
<u>concluded</u>	Having come or been brought to a conclusion.
conclusion	A final settlement. <i>He drew his conclusions quickly.</i>
<u>destination</u>	The ultimate goal for which something is done. <i>Delft is an ideal destination for a relaxing weekend.</i>
<u>determination</u>	Deciding or controlling something's outcome or nature. <i>The determination of molecular structures.</i>
end	Have an end in a temporal spatial or quantitative sense either spatial or metaphorical. <i>The ending of warranty period.</i>
ending	The act of ending something. <i>The ending of the Cold War.</i>
<u>final</u>	A series of games constituting the final stage of a competition. <i>The final chapter.</i>
finale	The temporal end; the concluding time. <i>A fireworks finale.</i>
finality	A tone or manner which indicates that no further comment or argument is possible. <i>The finality of death.</i>
finis	The concluding part of any performance. <i>The market was up at the finis.</i>
finish	Cause to finish a relationship with somebody. <i>He finished the dishes.</i>
mediate	Connected indirectly through another person or thing involving an intermediate agency. <i>Public law institutions are a type of mediate state administration.</i>
negotiate	Obtain or bring about by discussion. <i>They refused to negotiate with the rebels.</i>
negotiation	The activity or business of negotiating an agreement; coming to terms. <i>A worldwide ban is currently under negotiation.</i>
parley	Discuss, as between enemies. <i>A parley is in progress and the invaders may withdraw.</i>
peroration	(rhetoric) the concluding section of an oration. <i>He summarized his main points in his peroration.</i>

resolution	The number of pixels per square inch on a computer generated display the greater the resolution the better the picture. <i>Complete remission was defined as resolution of clinical evidence of disease.</i>
resolve	Reduce a subject, statement, etc. by mental analysis into (separate elements or a more elementary form). <i>Alpha zein is often resolved into two major size components.</i>
settle	Become settled or established and stable in one s residence or life style. <i>The unions have settled their year long dispute with Hollywood producers.</i>
settlement	The process of establishing a settlement or settlements. <i>The settlement of immigrants in the occupied territories.</i>
terminate	Terminate the employment of discharge from an office or position. <i>The train will terminate at Stratford.</i>
termination	An assassination. <i>The termination of a contract.</i>
truce	An agreement between enemies or opponents to stop fighting or arguing for a certain time. <i>The guerrillas called a three day truce.</i>
