## Synonyms of "Finalize" as a verb (18 Words)

<b>bring to a conclusion</b>	Take something or somebody with oneself somewhere.
<b>clinch</b>	Fasten a rope or angling line with a clinch knot. <i>The nails were <b>clinched</b>.</i>
<b>complete</b>	Complete a pass. <i>He <b>completed</b> his PhD in 1993.</i>
<b><u>conclude</u></b>	Bring or come to an end. <i>It s a wicked old world she <b>concluded</b>.</i>
<b>confirm</b>	Administer the religious rite of confirmation to. <i>Two recent experiences have <b>confirmed</b> me in this view.</i>
<b>decide</b>	Cause to decide. <i>The courts <b>decided</b> in favour of the New York claimants.</i>

<b>establish</b>	Build or establish something abstract. <i><b>Establish</b> a new department.</i>
<b>finalise</b>	Make final; put the last touches on; put into final form.
<b>nail down</b>	Complete a pass.
<b>put the finishing touches to</b>	Put into a certain place or abstract location.
<b>resolve</b>	Reduce a subject, statement, etc. by mental analysis into (separate elements or a more elementary form). <i>Symptoms <b>resolved</b> after a median of four weeks.</i>
<b>seal</b>	Close with or as if with a seal. <i>The pine boarding should be <b>sealed</b> with polyurethane.</i>
<b>secure</b>	Compress (a blood vessel) to prevent bleeding. <i>A loan <b>secured</b> on your home.</i>
<b>set the seal on</b>	Put into a certain place or abstract location.
<b>settle</b>	Give money or property to someone through a deed of settlement or a will. <i>He offered to <b>settle</b> 150 a year on her.</i>
<b>tie up</b>	Perform a marriage ceremony.
<b>work out</b>	Make uniform.
<b>wrap up</b>	Arrange or fold as a cover or protection.



## Usage Examples of "Finalize" as a verb

- *Efforts intensified to finalize plans for post-war reconstruction.*
- *Let's finalize the proposal.*





## Associations of "Finalize" (30 Words)

- agreement** Harmony or accordance in opinion or feeling.  
*The two parties were in **agreement**.*
- arbitration** The act of deciding as an arbiter; giving authoritative judgment.  
*They submitted their disagreement to **arbitration**.*
- armistice** An agreement made by opposing sides in a war to stop fighting for a certain time; a truce.  
*The Italian government signed an **armistice** with the Allies.*
- bargaining** The negotiation of the terms of a transaction or agreement.
- completion** The state of being finished.  
*The risk stays with the seller until **completion**.*
- compromise** Make a compromise arrive at a compromise.  
*We were not prepared to **compromise** on safety.*

<b><u>conclude</u></b>	Come to a close. <i>The doctors <b>concluded</b> that Esther had suffered a stroke.</i>
<b><u>concluded</u></b>	Having come or been brought to a conclusion.
<b>conclusion</b>	A final settlement. <i>He drew his <b>conclusions</b> quickly.</i>
<b><u>destination</u></b>	The ultimate goal for which something is done. <i>Delft is an ideal <b>destination</b> for a relaxing weekend.</i>
<b><u>determination</u></b>	Deciding or controlling something's outcome or nature. <i>The <b>determination</b> of molecular structures.</i>
<b>end</b>	Have an end in a temporal spatial or quantitative sense either spatial or metaphorical. <i>The <b>ending</b> of warranty period.</i>
<b>ending</b>	The act of ending something. <i>The <b>ending</b> of the Cold War.</i>
<b><u>final</u></b>	A series of games constituting the final stage of a competition. <i>The <b>final</b> chapter.</i>
<b>finale</b>	The temporal end; the concluding time. <i>A fireworks <b>finale</b>.</i>
<b>finality</b>	A tone or manner which indicates that no further comment or argument is possible. <i>The <b>finality</b> of death.</i>
<b>finis</b>	The concluding part of any performance. <i>The market was up at the <b>finis</b>.</i>
<b>finish</b>	Cause to finish a relationship with somebody. <i>He <b>finished</b> the dishes.</i>
<b>mediate</b>	Connected indirectly through another person or thing involving an intermediate agency. <i>Public law institutions are a type of <b>mediate</b> state administration.</i>
<b>negotiate</b>	Obtain or bring about by discussion. <i>They refused to <b>negotiate</b> with the rebels.</i>
<b>negotiation</b>	The activity or business of negotiating an agreement; coming to terms. <i>A worldwide ban is currently under <b>negotiation</b>.</i>
<b>parley</b>	Discuss, as between enemies. <i>A <b>parley</b> is in progress and the invaders may withdraw.</i>
<b>peroration</b>	(rhetoric) the concluding section of an oration. <i>He summarized his main points in his <b>peroration</b>.</i>



<b>resolution</b>	The number of pixels per square inch on a computer generated display the greater the resolution the better the picture. <i>Complete remission was defined as <b>resolution</b> of clinical evidence of disease.</i>
<b>resolve</b>	Reduce a subject, statement, etc. by mental analysis into (separate elements or a more elementary form). <i>Alpha zein is often <b>resolved</b> into two major size components.</i>
<b>settle</b>	Become settled or established and stable in one s residence or life style. <i>The unions have <b>settled</b> their year long dispute with Hollywood producers.</i>
<b>settlement</b>	The process of establishing a settlement or settlements. <i>The <b>settlement</b> of immigrants in the occupied territories.</i>
<b>terminate</b>	Terminate the employment of discharge from an office or position. <i>The train will <b>terminate</b> at Stratford.</i>
<b>termination</b>	An assassination. <i>The <b>termination</b> of a contract.</i>
<b>truce</b>	An agreement between enemies or opponents to stop fighting or arguing for a certain time. <i>The guerrillas called a three day <b>truce</b>.</i>
