### Definitions of "Finally" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “finally” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *The item at the end.*
- *In such a way as to put an end to doubt and dispute.*
- *As the end result of a succession or process.*
- *As the last in a series of related events or items.*
- *Used to introduce a final point or reason.*
- *After an unspecified period of time or an especially long delay.*
- *After a long time, typically when there has been difficulty or delay.*

<b>absolutely</b>	(of a verb) without a stated object. <i>You're <b>absolutely</b> right.</i>
<b>after a long time</b>	Happening at a time subsequent to a reference time.
<b>after some time</b>	Happening at a time subsequent to a reference time.
<b>by and by</b>	So as to pass a given point.
<b>conclusively</b>	In a conclusive way. <i>We settled the problem <b>conclusively</b>.</i>
<b>decisively</b>	In an indisputable degree. <i>We must respond <b>decisively</b> to protect our national interests.</i>
<b>definitely</b>	In a definite manner; clearly. <i>We couldn't plan to go elsewhere until we had heard from you more <b>definitely</b>.</i>

<b>for all time</b>	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent (‘whole’ is often used informally for ‘wholly’).
<b>for ever</b>	At all times; all the time and on every occasion.
<b>for good</b>	Completely and absolutely (‘good’ is sometimes used informally for ‘thoroughly’).
<b>in closing</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>in conclusion</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>in the end</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b><u>irrevocably</u></b>	In an irrevocable manner. <i>My life changed <b>irrevocably</b> in an instant.</i>
<b>last</b>	Especially in enumerating points lastly. <i>The <b>last</b> named film.</i>
<b>last but not least</b>	Most recently.
<b><u>lastly</u></b>	The item at the end. <i><b>Lastly</b> I would like to thank my parents.</i>
<b>once and for all</b>	As soon as.
<b>permanently</b>	In a way that lasts or remains unchanged indefinitely; for all time. <i>His lungs are <b>permanently</b> damaged.</i>
<b>ultimately</b>	As the end result of a succession or process. <i><b>Ultimately</b> he has only himself to blame.</i>

- *Finally, it is common knowledge that travel broadens the horizons.*
- *A referendum followed by local, legislative and, finally, presidential elections.*

<b><u>closing</u></b>	The act of closing something. <i>The <b>closing</b> scene of the film.</i>
<b>coda</b>	The closing section of a musical composition. <i>The first movement ends with a fortissimo <b>coda</b>.</i>
<b>completion</b>	A successful forward pass in football. <i>The <b>completion</b> date is early next year.</i>

<b>consequent</b>	Following or accompanying as a consequence. <i>The social problems of pupils and their <b>consequent</b> educational difficulties.</i>
<b>decisively</b>	With finality; conclusively. <i>The government will act <b>decisively</b> against all extremist activities.</i>
<b><u>destination</u></b>	The place designated as the end (as of a race or journey). <i>Delft is an ideal <b>destination</b> for a relaxing weekend.</i>
<b>encounter</b>	Come together. <i>She felt totally unnerved by the <b>encounter</b>.</i>
<b>end</b>	Have an end in a temporal spatial or quantitative sense either spatial or metaphorical. <i>The phone rang at the other <b>end</b>.</i>
<b>ending</b>	The act of ending something. <i>A nerve <b>ending</b>.</i>
<b>epilogue</b>	A short speech (often in verse) addressed directly to the audience by an actor at the end of a play. <i>A disastrous <b>epilogue</b> to the rest of his career.</i>
<b>eventually</b>	In the end, especially after a long delay, dispute, or series of problems. <i><b>Eventually</b> after midnight I arrived at the hotel.</i>
<b>expiry</b>	The end of a fixed period of time. <i>An <b>expiry</b> date.</i>
<b>extremity</b>	The degree to which something is extreme. <i>The peninsula s western <b>extremity</b>.</i>
<b><u>final</u></b>	The final match between the winners of all previous matches in an elimination tournament. <i>The <b>final</b> chapter.</i>
<b>finale</b>	The temporal end; the concluding time. <i>The festival ends with a grand <b>finale</b>.</i>
<b>finish</b>	Provide with a finish. <i>Falkirk <b>finished</b> fifth in the Scottish Premier League.</i>
<b>finishing</b>	The act of finishing. <i>The speaker s <b>finishing</b> was greeted with applause.</i>

<b>last</b>	The last mention or sight of someone or something. <i>A <b>last</b> resort.</i>
<b>lastly</b>	The item at the end. <i><b>Lastly</b> I would like to thank my parents.</i>
<b>peroration</b>	The concluding part of a speech, typically intended to inspire enthusiasm in the audience. <i>He again invoked the theme in an emotional <b>peroration</b>.</i>
<b>person-to-person</b>	A grammatical category used in the classification of pronouns, possessive determiners, and verb forms according to whether they indicate the speaker, the addressee, or a third party.
<b>reach</b>	Reach a goal. <i>The programme's daily <b>reach</b> is 400 000.</i>
<b>secondly</b>	In the second place. <i>He was presented first of all as a hopelessly unqualified candidate and <b>secondly</b> as an extremist.</i>
<b>termination</b>	An assassination. <i>A good result and a happy <b>termination</b>.</i>
