Associations of "Fine tune" (30 Words)

arpeggio	The notes of a chord played in rapid succession, either ascending or descending.
atonal	Characterized by avoidance of traditional western tonality. <i>Atonal music may be written by obscuring tonal structures or by ignoring conventional harmonies altogether.</i>
ballad	A poem or song narrating a story in short stanzas Traditional ballads are typically of unknown authorship having been passed on orally from one generation to the next.
chord	Play sing or arrange notes in chords. <i>The entire swing session is masterfully chorded by the Duke on piano.</i>
choreograph	Compose a sequence of dance steps, often to music. <i>Balanchine choreographed many pieces to Stravinsky s music.</i>
chromatic	Of an instrument able to play all the notes of the chromatic scale. <i>A chromatic scale.</i>
clef	A musical notation written on a staff indicating the pitch of the notes following it.
dancing	The activity of dancing for pleasure or in order to entertain others. <i>A dancing class.</i>
decibel	A unit used to measure the intensity of a sound or the power level of an electrical signal by comparing it with a given level on a logarithmic scale. <i>His voice went up several decibels.</i>
descant	Sing in descant. <i>I hear the wood thrush piping one mellow descant more.</i>
diatonic	Of a melody or harmony constructed from a diatonic scale.
euphony	The tendency to make phonetic change for ease of pronunciation. <i>The poet put euphony before mere factuality.</i>

guitar	A stringed instrument usually having six strings; played by strumming or plucking.
harmony	The quality of forming a pleasing and consistent whole. <i>The piece owes its air of tranquillity largely to the harmony.</i>
mazurka	Music composed for dancing the mazurka.
melody	The principal part in harmonized music. <i>He picked out an intricate melody on his guitar.</i>
music	The art or science of composing or performing music. <i>Couples were dancing to the music.</i>
octave	Each of the two notes at the extremes of an octave.
pop	Like a pop or with a pop. <i>Another thought popped into my mind.</i>
rhythm	The basic rhythmic unit in a piece of music. <i>Ruth listened to the rhythm of his breathing.</i>
rust	Any of various fungi causing rust disease in plants. <i>The steady dripping of water rusted the metal stopper in the sink.</i>
sing	Sing in accompaniment to a song or piece of music. <i>A stinging slap that made my ear sing.</i>
soprano	A part written for a soprano voice. <i>A good soprano voice.</i>
tenor	A singer with a tenor voice. <i>The Serenade for tenor horn and strings.</i>
timbre	The distinctive property of a complex sound (a voice or noise or musical sound). <i>You must demonstrate your moral timbre as a human being.</i>
tonal	Having tonality i e tones and chords organized in relation to one tone such as a keynote or tonic. <i>His ear for tonal colour.</i>
tonality	The harmonic effect of being in a particular key. <i>The sonata is noteworthy for its extensive variations of mood and tonality.</i>
tone	A steady sound without overtones. <i>The Beijing dialect uses four tones.</i>
treble	Sing treble. <i>The fish were caught with large treble hooks.</i>
tremolo	A mechanism in an organ producing a tremolo effect.
