*Forests set **ablaze** or **afire** by lightning.*
- afire** Lighted up by or as by fire or flame.
*Forests set **ablaze** or **afire** by lightning.*
- aflake** Lighted up by or as by fire or flame.
*Pour brandy over the steaks and then set **aflake**.*
- alight** Descend from a train, bus, or other form of transport.
*Candles **alight** on the tables.*
- blaze** Indicate by marking trees with blazes.
*He **blazed** a drive into the rough.*
- burn** Burn sear or freeze tissue using a hot iron or electric current or a caustic agent.
*The diesel engine was converted to **burn** natural gas.*

burning	The act of burning something. <i>The burning of leaves was prohibited by a town ordinance.</i>
cinder	Waste matter produced by smelting or refining ore; slag. <i>A cold hearth full of cinders.</i>
combust	Undergo combustion. <i>One day the whole building will combust.</i>
combustible	A combustible substance. <i>A volatile and combustible personality.</i>
combustion	The process of burning something. <i>Combustion grew until revolt was unavoidable.</i>
douse	Dip into a liquid. <i>Nothing could douse her sudden euphoria.</i>
erupt	Erupt or intensify suddenly. <i>Smoke bombs erupted everywhere.</i>
extinguish	Extinguish by crushing. <i>Too big to be extinguished at once the forest fires at best could be contained.</i>
fiery	Characterized by intense emotion. <i>A fiery desert wind.</i>
firefighter	A member of a fire department who tries to extinguish fires.
flame	A brilliant orange red colour like that of flames. <i>Send out an unsolicited email and you could possibly receive thousands of flames.</i>
flaming	Very hot. <i>Her flaming hair.</i>
flammable	Easily ignited. <i>The use of highly flammable materials.</i>
flare	Become flared and widen usually at one end. <i>The dress flared out into a huge train.</i>
igneous	Of fire; fiery. <i>An igneous desert atmosphere.</i>
ignite	Arouse or inflame (an emotion or situation). <i>The words ignited new fury in him.</i>
incinerate	Cause to undergo combustion. <i>The paper incinerated quickly.</i>

lava	Rock that in its molten form as magma issues from volcanos lava is what magma is called when it reaches the surface. <i>Tablelands of lava.</i>
pyrotechnic	Suggestive of fireworks. <i>A pyrotechnic wit.</i>
smolder	Have strong suppressed feelings. <i>A smoldering fire.</i>
smoulder	Smoke coming from a smouldering fire. <i>The smoulder suddenly became a blaze.</i>
stoke	Encourage or incite (a strong emotion or tendency). <i>He stoked up the barbecue.</i>
volcanic	(of a feeling or emotion) bursting out or liable to burst out violently. <i>A volcanic temper.</i>
volcano	A mountain formed by volcanic material. <i>Clare had been building up a silent volcano of resentment.</i>
