## Associations of "Fireworks" (30 Words)

<b>blast</b>	Hit hard. <i><b>Blast</b> a tunnel through the Alps.</i>
<b>blaze</b>	Indicate by marking trees with blazes. <i>He <b>blazed</b> away at the men.</i>
<b>bomb</b>	Throw bombs at or attack with bombs. <i>The Americans <b>bombed</b> Dresden.</i>
<b>burn</b>	Burn with heat fire or radiation. <i>Her forehead was <b>burning</b> and her throat ached.</i>
<b>burst</b>	Cause to burst. <i>The mortar <b>bursts</b> were further away than before.</i>
<b>carnival</b>	An annual festival, typically during the week before Lent in Roman Catholic countries, involving processions, music, dancing, and the use of masquerade. <i>Children from Wroughton are getting ready for the village <b>carnival</b>.</i>
<b>combust</b>	Undergo combustion. <i>Riots <b>combusted</b> Pakistan after the U S air attacks on Afghanistan.</i>
<b>detonation</b>	Combustion of a substance which is initiated suddenly and propagates extremely rapidly, giving rise to a shock wave. <i>A series of deafening <b>detonations</b> was heard.</i>
<b>effusion</b>	An instance of giving off something such as a liquid or gas. <i>Literary <b>effusions</b>.</i>
<a href="#">erupt</a>	Erupt or intensify suddenly. <i>Unrest <b>erupted</b> in the country.</i>
<b>eruption</b>	A spot, rash, or other mark appearing suddenly on the skin. <i>Irritable skin <b>eruptions</b>.</i>
<a href="#">explode</a>	Burst or shatter violently and noisily as a result of rapid combustion, excessive internal pressure, or other process. <i>This is ludicrous she <b>exploded</b>.</i>

<b>explosion</b>	The noise caused by an explosion. <i>An <b>explosion</b> of laughter.</i>
<b>explosive</b>	(of a vocal sound) produced with a sharp release of air. <i>An <b>explosive</b> laugh.</i>
<b>fire</b>	Drive out or away by or as if by fire. <i>With a flick of his wrist he <b>-fired</b> up the chainsaw.</i>
<b>flame</b>	A thing compared to a flame s ability to burn fiercely or be extinguished. <i>A <b>flame</b> red Alfa Romeo.</i>
<b>flare</b>	Become flared and widen usually at one end. <i>The <b>flare</b> of the match lit up his face.</i>
<b>ignite</b>	Start to burn or burst into flames. <i>Great heat can <b>ignite</b> almost any dry matter.</i>
<b>incandescence</b>	The phenomenon of light emission by a body as its temperature is raised.
<b>kindle</b>	Call forth (emotions, feelings, and responses). <i>The setting sun <b>kindled</b> the sky with oranges and reds.</i>
<b>lava</b>	Rock that in its molten form as magma issues from volcanos lava is what magma is called when it reaches the surface. <i>Porphyritic <b>lavas</b>.</i>
<b>matchbox</b>	Very small. <i>Her <b>matchbox</b> apartment.</i>
<b>nebula</b>	(pathology) a faint cloudy spot on the cornea.
<b>parade</b>	A parade ground. <i>He <b>paraded</b> his knowledge.</i>
<b>pyrotechnic</b>	Of or relating to the craft of making fireworks. <i>A <b>pyrotechnic</b> display.</i>
<b>pyrotechnics</b>	The craft of making fireworks. <i>He thrilled his audience with vocal <b>pyrotechnics</b>.</i>
<b>scald</b>	Any of a number of plant diseases which produce an effect similar to that of scalding especially a disease of fruit marked by browning and caused by excessive sunlight bad storage conditions or atmospheric pollution. <i><b>Scald</b> the milk with the citrus zest.</i>
<b>spark</b>	Produce sparks at the point where an electric circuit is interrupted. <i>A <b>spark</b> of interest.</i>
<b>tinder</b>	Material for starting a fire. <i>He lit it with a <b>tinder</b>.</i>
<b>volcano</b>	A mountain formed by volcanic material. <i>Clare had been building up a silent <b>volcano</b> of resentment.</i>
